

## PASTOR'S NOTES

### Understanding Confirmation/Eucharist

On Sunday, April 25<sup>th</sup> at 5 p.m. Bishop John Folda will be here at St. Leo's to celebrate the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist for the first time for young parishioners from St. Leo's, St. Benedict in Wild Rice and St. Maurice in Kindred. Please pray that day may be rich in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the lives of these young one, their families and parishes.

As you know Confirmation is one the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. In the Acts of the Apostles we read that even though people were baptized there was this other ritual of 'laying on of hands' and calling forth the Holy Spirit [AA 8:12-17; 19:1-7]. These biblical references give rise to the eventual liturgical celebrations of Baptism and Confirmation.

Baptism celebrates one's entry into the death and resurrection of Christ, which stands at the very heart of Easter faith. Baptism makes us 'new creatures' because we have been 'born again'. As we know, Christ did not just rise from the dead, but after his Ascension to heaven, he sends the Holy Spirit upon his believers (the Church) on Pentecost. From that day forward the Church saw itself as a people with the mission of continuing the ministry of Christ to the ends of the world unto the end of time.

**The sacrament of Confirmation is deeply tied to the Pentecost story.** Like the believers on Pentecost it is not enough to be baptized. The gift of Christ's life-giving death was freely given and must, in turn, be freely given to others. We must leave the waters of Baptism and become missionaries for Christ in the world. Just as Pentecost completes Easter, analogously Confirmation completes Baptism.

God assists this missionary impulse by deepening within us the **7-fold gifts of the Holy Spirit** who first came to us in the waters of Baptism [*Knowledge, Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Piety, Fortitude and Fear of the Lord*].

As these gifts take root in our lives we should begin to see the **12 fruits of the Spirit** in our thoughts, words and deeds [*charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control and chastity*].

In turn the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that some effects of Confirmation should be a more deeply rooted life of faith that cries out *Abba, Father*, a deeper bond with the Church, and strength to both spread and defend the faith by boldly proclaiming Christ and never being ashamed of the Cross {CCC 1301}.

It seems obvious that the life of our 'new missionaries' needs to be constantly nourished by the risen life of Christ. Such is the gift of **Eucharist** - the Body and Blood of Christ. At his last supper on earth Christ took the bread and wine of the Jewish Passover meal and declared it to be his body and blood and then invited them - *'Do this in memory of me'*! At that same last supper Christ promises to send the Holy Spirit who would be with us always and instruct us in everything and remind us of all he told us. With the sacrament of the Eucharist as 'food for the journey' the **sacraments of initiation** {*Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist*} have come to completion.

With this understanding in mind let us join our confirmands in rightful joy as they celebrate this milestone in their lives of faith. Please keep these young men and women in your prayers this week as they will soon be confirmed and fed with the life of Christ for the first time:
