#### The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Fr. Ermer has asked me (Deacon Matt Kensok) to discuss the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Assumption of Mary is always celebrated on August 15<sup>th</sup> and is a holy day of obligation in the United States. This year, the solemnity falls on a Sunday, replacing the 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a *dogma* of the Church. A dogma is a truth revealed by God, which the magisterium of the Church has declared as binding to the Christian people. Throughout her history, the Catholic Church has declared four Marian dogmas: Mary as the **Mother of God** (Council of Ephesus, 431), Mary's **Perpetual Virginity** (Lateran Council, 649), Mary's **Immaculate Conception** (*Ineffabilis Deus*, 1854), and finally Mary's **Assumption** (*Munificentissimus Deus*, 1950).

The dogma of the Assumption was defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950 in his Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*. In that document, Pius XII answers the question: What is the Assumption? The Pope writes, "we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

The dogma of the Assumption follows from the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. If Mary was preserved from all stain of sin, then she could also be preserved from the effects of sin, namely death and bodily corruption. Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox theologians have posited two views in answer to the question: Did Mary die before she was assumed into heaven? Some Catholics think that Mary did not die before being assumed into heaven, and the phrase, "having completed the course of her earthly life" leaves the question open. On the other hand, the Eastern Orthodox Church calls the feast the *Dormition of the Mother of God*. The term "dormition" refers to a "falling asleep" (death) of Mary—a temporary separation of her soul and body. Pius XII acknowledged this tradition without endorsing or rejecting it.

It might come as a surprise that this dogma was only defined about 70 years ago. But the tradition has been believed throughout the Church's history. Even in the Bible, in his heavenly vision, John sees "a woman, clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars" (Rev 12:1). This "woman" has been interpreted as Israel or the Church, but also as Mary.

Several writers of the early Church acknowledged the Assumption of Mary, such as St. Germanus of Constantinople or St. John Damascene. As an example, Gregory of Tours, writing in the 6<sup>th</sup> century said, "[T]he Apostles took up her body on a bier and placed it in a tomb; and they guarded it, expecting the Lord to come. And behold, again the Lord stood by them; and the holy body having been received, He commanded that it be taken in a cloud into paradise: where now, rejoined to the soul, [Mary] rejoices with the Lord's chosen ones."

The Solemnity of the Assumption is a great reminder to us. Mary is now living with God in heaven with her body and soul. We too hope to be with God in heaven with our resurrected bodies, as we profess every Sunday in the Creed: "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen."
