PASTOR'S NOTES

'Mass' — a highly ritualized meal (part two)

For four of the last 5 Sundays our Gospel readings have come from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel [Jn. 6]. In those readings Christ declares himself to be 'the bread of life' and that he gives us his flesh and blood to eat and drink. John 6 is seemingly Christ's own commentary on the Last Supper accounts in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke where Jesus takes the bread and wine of the Passover meal and declares it to be his body and blood and asks us to do this in remembrance of him. **True disciples must be a people of the Eucharist**, *i.e.* go to Mass.

Christ left us himself in the context of a meal. At any good meal friends gather – they tell stories – they eat food. In a most profound sense the Eucharist is a highly ritualized meal. In the first part of the Mass, called the Liturgy of the Word, we tell stories of faith. In the second part, called the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we eat sacred food – Christ's Body and Blood! Two weeks ago I offered some reflections of the Liturgy of the Word. Today I would like to offer some spiritual understanding of this second part -- the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It has three distinct parts: the Offertory followed by the Eucharistic prayer and ending with the Communion rite.

During the Offertory the Offertory collection is a highly spiritual event. Having heard the wonder of God's love in the Liturgy of the Word even to the point of Christ pouring out his entire life on the cross, the Offertory collections offers us the opportunity to give generously of ourselves as the Lord did/does for us. In the Offertory procession the bread and wine that will become the Lord's Body and Blood is accompanied by our Offertory collection [a beginning sign of our communion with God]. At the altar the bread and wine are prepared and finally in prayer we are told that this offering is a sacrifice [a reference to Christ's sacrificial death on the cross].

The second part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist – **the Eucharistic prayer** – begins with the <u>Preface prayer</u> that ends with the <u>Holy, Holy</u>. These are the words proclaimed by the heavenly hosts around the throne of God in heaven [Is. 6:3; Rev. 4:8]. At Mass when we sing the *Holy, Holy* we are reminded that heaven and earth are meeting on our altar. During the Eucharistic prayer the priest prays the very words Christ spoke over the bread and wine of the Last Supper. This is called the <u>prayer of consecration</u>, which transforms the bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. After the prayer of consecration every Eucharistic prayer reminds that the <u>entire 3-fold Church is here with us</u> – those already in heaven (*Mary and the saints*) {often called the <u>Church Triumphant</u>}; the Church on earth led by the Pope and each local bishop {often called the <u>Church Militant</u>}; and those who have died in faith but still in need of our purifying prayers {often called the <u>Church Suffering</u>}. We end the Eucharistic prayer by <u>elevating Christ's Body and Blood</u> remembering Christ's elevation on the Cross of Calvary.

As we enter the third and last part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist – **the Communion rite** – we pray the Lord's prayer as Christ taught and acknowledge the Father, who once again sends his Son into our midst as Lord and Savior! Then we are invited to share a sign of peace with those around us reminding us there can be no true love of God or communion with God without a loving communion with our brothers and sisters. Once that gesture of peace is offered we proclaim Christ is the Lamb of God whose broken body and spilled blood brought true peace to the world. On our part we acknowledge we are unworthy to partake of this ultimate gift of peace. Yet God desires us to live in communion with us, and so we come with crowned hands to do as he asked of us – eat my Body! – drink my Blood! After purifying the sacred vessels that held the Body and Blood of Christ we pray a final prayer and are blessed to go on our way glorifying God by living a life worthy of what we have just received. Such is the glory of the Mass!!!

Hopefully we come to Mass because like Peter in today's Gospel we can say, "You have the words of eternal life.

We have come to believe and are convinced you are the Holy One of God."
