A brother's death —

On August 15, 2002 at 2:10 a.m. my younger brother, Jack, died of pancreatic cancer at the Sanford Hospice House in downtown Fargo. He first received diagnosis of pancreatic cancer in March of 2019. In the intervening months he did chemotherapy and a whipple surgery. He did the usual medical procedures, but in the end cancer had its way.

Jack, as he was known in family circles, but John to those who knew him in the Fargo area, had no previous health issues. He was fit and kept himself in good shape, but a long life was not to be.

It is very difficult to bury a brother four years younger than yourself. It just seems it should not be that way. All of sudden the Word of God speaks to that reality—

> "For the age that is honorable comes not with the passing of time, nor can it be measured in terms of years. Rather understanding is the hoary crown for men and an unsullied life, the attainment of old age.

He who pleased God was loved ...

Having become perfect in a short while, he reached the fullness of a long career; for his soul was pleasing to the Lord..." [Wisdom 4:8-10a,13-14a]

I find great comfort in these words because I find great comfort in my brother's life of faith, his deep involvement in the life of Nativity parish, his deep abiding friendships with the 7:45 a.m. Sunday Mass group at Nativity, his long-time membership and work on the church's finance committee, his commitment to the work of Nativity Knights of Columbus, his very regular attendance of Sunday Mass and weekday Mass occasionally, his reception of the Last Rites of the Church [Reconciliation {Confession}, Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum {last Eucharist}]. For a guy who was a bachelor all his life, he 'done good'. Jack, may you rest in peace!

On a related note, it is certainly good to be anointed anytime someone is scheduled for surgery. The anointing of the sick is one of the Church's 7 sacraments, which celebrates God's healing love for the human family. Many time we celebrate that anointing after communion at a daily or Sunday Mass. If circumstances are otherwise, this anointing can be done to fit your schedule. Please call Fr.
