PASTOR'S NOTES

Eucharist – the pearl of great price

This Sunday's Gospel reading is the last of our 5-week examination of the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, famously known as the <u>Bread of Life Discourse</u>. In that discourse Jesus declares himself to be the Bread of Life come down from heaven. This bread is his flesh for the life of the world and all who eat of it will live forever and be raised up on the last day. **These are phenomenal statements.** Some walk away. Others see Jesus as the Holy One of God. What do you think? Do we take Jesus at his word?

John 6 is foundational to the Church's teaching of Christ Real Presence in the Eucharist. **This Presence** is not figurative language nor symbolic words. This is Christ's life given for the life of the world. To eat of it is to live forever. Not to eat of it is to have no life. **The Eucharist is a matter of life and death!**

Out of this conviction of faith has come a number of Eucharistic practices:

- (1) <u>Most prominently</u> the serious obligation of regularly **attending Sunday Mass**. To knowingly and willfully miss what Christ has asked of us *to do this in remembrance of him* would be a serious sin. Sunday celebrates the day of Christ's Resurrection and at Sunday Mass he feeds us with his risen and glorified body and blood. St. Hilary of Potiers spoke of the seriousness of this matter when he declared: "Christ will take to himself only the flesh of those who have received his flesh."
- (2) **Daily Mass** beside Sunday Mass the Church celebrates daily Mass. In many ways this copies the fact that for 40 years God miraculously fed his people with daily bread from heaven called manna during their Exodus from Egypt to the Promised Land of Israel. Daily Mass spiritually fulfills what we pray in the Lord's prayer "give us this day our daily bread".
- (3) The gift of the Lord's Body and Blood is not just for those who can make it to Mass, but **taking Communion to the homebound and hospitalized** is a treasured and essential gift of Eucharistic outreach. Never hesitate to call your parish and ask to have Communion brought to loved ones who find themselves so constrained.
- (4) **Viaticum** This Latin word gets translated as *'being with you on the way'*. At the end of our earthly lives receiving the Lord's Body and Blood (in Communion) would be the greatest gift one can possess as one passes over from this world to the next.

Being in communion with the Lord's Body and Blood means eternal life. Offering the Lord's Body and Blood in Communion stands at the heart of Church life and with that life comes many fruits as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches [CCC 1391-1401]:

- > foretaste of the promise of heavenly glory;
- $> {\it preserves},$ deepens, increases and renews the life of baptismal grace;
- > cleanses us from venial sins and preserves us from future mortal sins;
- $> {\it strengthens}$ our charity and commits us to the poor;
- > enkindles our hearts and minds to pray and work for the restoration of Christian unity.

Such is the glory of the Eucharist and being in communion with the Lord's Body and Blood. With St. Paul we can say —

"Who will separate us the from the love of Christ? Trial, or distress, or persecution, or hunger, or nakedness, or danger, or the sword? ... Yet in all of this we are more than conquerors because of him who has loved us. For I am certain that neither death nor life, neither angels nor principalities, neither the present nor the future, nor powers, neither height nor depth nor any other creature, will be able to separate us from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, our Lord." [Rom. 8:35-39]
