PASTOR'S NOTES

Starting the New Year 'on the right foot'

I would suspect everyone hopes that 2021 will be a better year than the one that has just passed. Getting back to 'normal' would be great!

Perhaps one of the best ways we can do that is to review past promises/vows we have made (especially to God). In fact keeping such promises is one of the ways we fulfill the First Commandment. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Baptism and Confirmation, Matrimony and Holy Orders always entail promises ... Fidelity to promises made to God is a sign of the respect owed to the divine majesty and of love for a faithful God." [2101]

Here is a summary of those promises:

> Parents as they have their children baptized

"accept the responsibility of training them in the practice of the faith";

"bring them up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor";

"See that the divine life which God gives (this child) is kept safe from the power of sin..."

in addition and in the name of their child – the parents renounce Satan, all his works and empty show and make a three-fold profession of faith in the Trinity (the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit)

> For those confirmed

Confirmands renew for themselves what their parents declared for them at their baptism by renouncing Satan, all his works and empty show and make a 4-fold profession of faith in which belief in the Holy Spirit is divided into 2 parts of which the first part asks — *"Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who came upon the Apostles at Pentecost and today is given to you sacramentally in Confirmation?"*. Desiring to be empowered by the seven (7) gifts of the Holy Spirit *[knowledge, wisdom, understanding, counsel, piety, fortitude and fear of the Lord]* we are called to be saints.

> For those married

"have you come here freely and without reservation to give yourselves to each other in marriage?"

"will you love and honor each other as husband and wife for the rest of your lives?"

"will you accept children lovingly from God and bring them according according to the law of Christ and his Church?"

Then the vows state that they take each other as husband or wife by declaring:

"I promise to be true to you in good times and bad, in sickness and in health. I will love and honor you all the days of my life."

> For those ordained to the priesthood

"(be) a conscientious fellow worker with the bishops in caring for the Lord's flock";

"celebrate the mysteries of Christ faithfully ... for the glory of God and the sanctification of Christ's people";

"exercise the ministry of the word worthily and wisely, preaching the Gospel and explaining the Catholic faith";

"consecrate your life to God ... unite yourself more closely every day to Christ ..."

May 2021 be blessed by the fulfillment of our promises!!
