
#### Knight of Columbus – Family Game Night:

### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### Advent Reconciliation —

### Prepare ye the way of the Lord ...

Coming clean and starting anew is good psychological medicine. Those involved in Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) know the *gift of the 5<sup>th</sup> step* of their 12-step program. The 5<sup>th</sup> step is a moral review of one's life and sitting down and sharing that review with another person. It is in the very honest telling of the lies, the deceptions, the duplicity and the moral failings of one's life that a spirit of renewal begins to bud forth in that person's life.

During the Advent season John the Baptist is the dominant voice in our Scripture readings. He speaks of repentance and making straight a path so the Lord can enter our lives. We must level the mountains of arrogance and pride, and fill in the valleys of deficit moral living. We need to come clean so a spirit of renewal can take hold of our lives.

Christ knows the human spirit. He shared our human nature in all ways but sin. Christ knows how humanity can be seduced into lies, deception and duplicity. He knows this deficit moral living has a cancerous effect on conscience and moral living. People convince ourselves they are not 'big time' sinners like Adolph Hitler or Joseph Stalin. But slowly and surely consciences become deaf and blind to what is truly good and right. Spiritual lives become lethargic and compromised. What they do and how they live gives scandal to family and friends. What was thought to be private and personal has now become public and 'out there'. Family life stumbles from lack of nobility and integrity. Young ones see hypocrisy and duplicity and the downward cycle continues.

**Yet at the same** time stories are told of martyrs and mystics, of saints and angels, of a call to holiness and a promise of life without end to all who give themselves to Jesus Christ.

Jesus promises forgiveness seventy times seven times to all who forsake the lure of sin and seek the Kingdom of God. On the night of his resurrection from the dead his first public words to his apostles were, *"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men's sins, they are forgiven them; if you hold them bound, they are held bound."* Christ left his Church the gift of his reconciling love in the sacrament of Reconciliation. During this Advent season area Catholic Churches schedule Reconciliation services. **St. Leo's is scheduled for Friday, December 20<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m.** 

Like the 5<sup>th</sup> step in the AA program we come confessing our deficit moral living and leave absolved, resurrected and flush with a new lease on life. What a gift! What a treasure!

### Taking Stock ...

As we come to the end of another calendar year I bring the following financial information to your attention:

#### Diocesan Capital Campaign

- > 57 of 260 St. Leo's households have pledged \$239,080 towards our goal of \$289,086 leaving us a balance of \$50,006 yet to pledge;
- > 14 of 45 St. Thomas households have pledged \$30,770 towards our goal of \$49,536 leaving us a balance of \$18,766 yet to pledge.

- > 74 of 259 St. Leo's households have pledged \$42,278 towards our goal of \$61,723 leaving us \$19,445 short of our goal;
- > 14 of 42 St. Thomas households have pledged \$5925 towards our goal of \$9893 leaving us \$3968 short of our goal.
