

This week's Stewardship moment:



PASTOR'S NOTES

A preface

Christmas usually elicits fond memories of a babe born in a manger along with doting parents standing at his side. The child gets visited by shepherds and magi.

But this is no normal birth. It is a virgin birth, i.e., there was no usual father involved in the conception. As Scripture says, conception came about by "... the Holy Spirit will come upon you (Mary) and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; hence the holy offspring to be born will be called Son of God." [Lk. 1:35] What lies behind this mystery of words? Is there a plan of some sort going on? What does all of this mean?

[Two spiritual writers address this mystery known as the Incarnation: **Diognetus** was a late 2^{nd} century writer who attempts to explain the Christian God to pagans; **Pope St. Leo the Great** (400-461) was the 45th Pope in the life of the Church *{our patron saint}*, and wrote extensively about the divine personhood of Christ.]

<u>Christmas</u> began with the Fall —

The human story began in Paradise, but the Fall got us kicked out. **But**, God would not give up on us *(the best of his creative acts)*. He devised a plan of redemption for the human race and shared it with his Son. He would do nothing without our cooperation.

Diognetus writes, "{God} allowed us to follow our own whim, be swept along by unruly passions, to be led astray by pleasure and desire. Not that he was pleased by our sins: he only tolerated them. Not that he approved of that time of sin." He sent patriarchs and prophets to no avail. "When we had made it clear that we could not enter God's kingdom by our own power, we were to be enabled to do it by the power of God."

"The time came then for God to make known his kindness and power ... he was patient with us, bore with us, and in compassion took our sins upon himself."

St. Leo the Great writes, "The Holy Spirit had not yet come upon the Virgin nor had the power of the Most High overshadowed her, so that within her spotless womb Wisdom might build herself a new house and the Word become flesh. The divine nature and the nature of a servant were to be united in one person so that the Creator of time might be born in time, and he through whom all things were made might be brought forth in their midst."

"For unless the new man, by being made in the likeness of sinful humanity, had taken on himself the nature of our first parents, <u>unless he had stooped to be one in substance with his mother while sharing the Father's substance and, being alone free from sin, united our nature to his, the whole human race would still be held captive under the dominion of Satan.</u> The Conqueror's victory would have profited us nothing if the battle had been fought outside our human condition."

Diognetus writes, "... he gave his own Son as the price of our redemption, the holy one to redeem the wicked, the sinless one to redeem sinners, the just one to redeem the unjust, the incorruptible one to redeem the corruptible, the immortal one to redeem mortals. For what else could have covered our sins but his sinlessness? Where else could we – wicked and sinful as we were – have found the means of holiness except in the Son of God alone? ... how inconceivable a blessing! The wickedness of the many is covered up in the holy One, and the holiness of One sanctifies many sinners."

Or as St. Leo's says, "But through this wonderful blending the mystery of new birth shown upon us, so that through the same Spirit by whom Christ was conceived and brought forth we too might be born again in a spiritual birth; and in consequence the evangelist [John] declares the faithful 'to have been born not of blood, nor of desire of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God'."

Such is Christmas and the wonder of His love.
