#### Ongoing church notes regarding COVID ...

With the declining numbers of active cases, hospitalizations and deaths along with a good start at mass vaccinations, the Diocese of Fargo has given the green light for us once again to have holy water in our fonts and lifted the restriction on congregational singing.

Given these modifications along with State modifications regarding occupancy rates and in-person schooling it seems we can once again invite our children to bring their Sunday Offertory envelopes to the Offertory basket on the front step of the sanctuary as well as inviting them to the front of the church to receive their children's bulletin at the end of Mass.

Once again parishioners will be invited to bring up the gifts of bread, wine and the Offertory collection basket in the Offertory procession. We are planning to adjust our pew ropes (2 open pews followed by 1 closed pew) allowing larger family groupings to more comfortably sit together all the while **expecting everyone to use prudence** in maintaining appropriate distancing between non-family groups.

These practices will begin this coming Monday.

## Preplanning . . . . . 10 days out —

#### Lent is just 10 days away!

Usually Lent sneaks up on us and all of a sudden we find ourselves in the midst of deciding of how to fruitfully engage the spirit of Lent. Lent challenges us to an intensification of the three legs of the spiritual life — **prayer**, **almsgiving and fasting**. These three legs of the spiritual life are directly related to the three basic relationships that comprise our lives:

1) our relationship <u>with God</u> [prayer];

2) our relationship <u>with others</u> [almsgiving];

3) our relationship <u>with ourselves</u> [fasting].

Here are some preliminary Lenten thoughts for your consideration:

#### > <u>in what ways could Lent 2021</u> be more rich in prayer?

\* read a little something about each of the 11 saints whose feast days fall during this 40-day Lenten season {consult the church calendar for the 11 saints days};

\* celebrate daily Mass when able;

- \* pray Stations of the Cross on Lenten Friday evenings;
- \* plan to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation at one of the many area Lenten Reconciliation Services.

## > in what ways could Lent 2021 be more attentive to the needs of others {almsgiving?}

- \* phone calls, Easter greeting cards, visits to persons in nursing homes, hospitals or home-bound;
- \* being generous to our Lenten canister collections and the special collections on Ash Wednesday and Holy Thursday;
- \* strive towards tithing and/or sacrificial church offertory giving;
- \* support the God's Gift Appeal of the Diocese of Fargo.

## > in what ways could Lent 2021 be more self-disciplined {fasting}?

- \* choose a spiritual or corporal work of mercy as a particular goal for this Lent;
- \* honor <u>both</u> Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as days of **fast** [no meat] and **abstinence** [only 1 full meal with the other two being much smaller]
- \* honor Lenten Fridays as days of **fast** [no meat];
- \* make a concerted effort to break the rule of a disordered passion in one's life {alcohol, porn, drugs, tobacco, etc.}.
