PASTOR'S NOTES

The Presentation of the Lord – February 2nd

February 2^{nd} is the 40th day after Christmas and is known as *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord*. In some places this feast day marks the end of the Christmas season. This **comes from it being the 40th day** and is based on the <u>40 years</u> of the Exodus story, or the <u>40 days and nights</u> it rained in Noah's time before God begins a new covenant with the human race, or the <u>40 days</u> Moses spent on Mt. Sinai when he received the Ten Commandments, or the <u>40 days</u> of temptation Christ spent in the desert. Forty signifies a time of significance in the life of human beings.

Over the course of history this feast day has had at least four different points of reflection:

(1) At times this day was called the **Purification of Mary.** Old Testament law **[Lev. 12:1-18]** required every mother to offer a purification sacrifice in Jerusalem 40 days after the birth of a male child. But Mary was sinless. Therefore she has no need to offer such a sacrifice. Yet like Christ and his baptism by John the Baptist, he joins in solidarity with the Jewish faith and religious practices of his day. In similar fashion Mary joins in solidarity with the faith and religious practices of her time in regard to her son.

(2) At the present time this day is called the **Presentation of the Lord.** Old Testament law **[Ex. 13:2,12; Num.18:16]** noted that every first-born male belonged to God and needed to be '*ransomed or redeemed*' usually within a month or so of his birth. At the time God freed the Israelites from Egyptian slavery the first-born in the land of Egypt, who had not put the 'blood of the lamb' on their doorposts, suffered death. Now every firstborn male of the Jewish race needed to be redeemed. So Joseph, Mary and Jesus are in Jerusalem not only for Mary's purification but also to 'redeem' Jesus. Again Jesus already comes from the Father and has no need of redemption, but they abide by the religious law of their time.

(3) At times you may hear this day called **Candlemas** day. By the year 400 a procession of lighted candles had become part of this feast probably because of Simeon's declaration of Christ being a light for the revelation for the gentiles during Jesus' presentation in the Temple. To this day some churches bless candles and carry them in procession into their parish churches proclaiming Christ as the light of the world. Therefore, the name Candle Mass.

(4) Lastly this day is often seen as the fulfillment of what Israel's last prophet, Malachi, declared, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me; And suddenly there will come to the temple, the Lord whom you seek ..." [Mal. 3:1-4]. On this day Jesus makes his first entry into his Father's temple in Jerusalem.

For our part the *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord* offers a number of reflection points about our faith and our belief in Christ, who enters our churches and offers the sacrifice of his body and blood for the salvation of mankind and serves as the Light of the World.

Blessing of Throats

Every February 3rd the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Blaise, who is often associated with the Catholic sacramental of the *Blessing of Throats*. Since the 8th century St. Blaise has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. The Church's book of blessings states, "*In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of a Christian* ... In that spirit there will be the *Blessing of Throats* at St. Leo's on Monday, February 3rd at the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. daily Mass.
