PASTOR'S NOTES

Valentine's Day — what's the scoop?

Over the years when mid February rolls around, I love asking people what big day is upcoming and most people will respond – *Valentine's Day*. When asked what day is St. Valentine's feast day? – a number of people say February 14th. Seems logical since that day is called Valentine's day on our calendars, but when you look at the Church calendar of saints – February 14th lists Saints Cyril and Methodius as the saints of that day. **So,** what's the scoop???

The Church does record the death of a martyred Roman priest name Valentine on February 14th in the mid 200s. He was buried in a Roman cemetery. After these facts the story becomes quite murky and a legend emerged that before his martyrdom and while imprisoned Valentine healed his jailer's daughter of blindness. Just prior to his execution he supposedly wrote that girl a note signing it *'Your Valentine'*. Thus, over the centuries has come the practice of sending Valentine cards. Beyond Valentine's martyrdom nothing of this legend story is historically verifiable. Since Vatican II [1962-65] and the revision of the Roman calendar of saints, the Church has much more strictly adhered to the principle of being historically accurate about the lives of saints whom are put forth for our veneration.

In our present time Valentine's day is connected with the theme of love and the sending of 'valentine cards/ gifts'. In that spirit I thought I might share some thoughts about married love that comes from Pope Francis' 2016 encyclical letter on Marriage and Family life that is titled *Amoris Laetitia*, which is translated into English as the **Joy of Love**. Pope Francis wrote this reflection after having called and listened to what two synods of bishops and lay people had said about marriage and family life in our contemporary world.

Amoris Laetitia contains nine chapters of reflections. Chapter four is titled <u>Love in Marriage</u>. Natural marriage is one thing, but the sacrament of marriage is of another level. In speaking of the sacrament of marriage Pope Francis writes—

"... God is, as it were, 'mirrored' in them; he impresses in them his own features and the indelible character of his love. Marriage is the icon of God's love for us. ... God makes of the two spouses one single existence."

This kind of love is the greatest form of friendship. Beyond the typical dimensions of friendship (i.e, concern for others, reciprocity, etc.),

"... those who marry do not expect their excitement to fade. Those who witness the celebration of a loving union, however fragile, trust that it will pass the test of time. Children not only want their parents to love one another, but also to be faithful and remain together. These and similar signs show that it is the very nature of conjugal love to be definitive. The lasting union expressed by the marriage vows is more than a formality or a traditional union ... For believers it is also a covenant before God that calls for fidelity: ... promising love for ever is possible when we perceive a plan bigger than our own ideas and undertakings, a plan which sustains us and enables us to surrender our future entirely to the one we love."

Such love is marked by joy and beauty. Joy is more than the search for pleasure. Rather joy increases our pleasure and helps us find fulfillment in any number of things, even when physical pleasure has ebbed. St. Thomas tells us this is possible because joy refers to an expansion of the heart. Beauty, for its part, sees the 'great worth' of another person.

"Beauty ... enables us to appreciate the sacredness of a person, without feeling a need to possess it ... Loving another person involves the joy of contemplating and appreciating their innate beauty and sacredness, which is greater than my needs."

It is that spirit of married love that we pray is found in our families and marriages.
