PASTOR'S NOTES

Two (2) Prayer requests this week —

Our personal and family lives are filled with many pressing needs seeking the power and gift of prayer. Not the least of which is the COVID pandemic affecting the whole world. On top of that two historical events have plagued the human family of which the Church earnestly seeks our prayers for healing and renewal of minds and hearts.

1) January 18-25 is the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*.

Two great splits have happened in the history of Christianity. One took place in the 1000s when Christian churches split between the East and the West. Those Eastern churches are today collectively known as the Orthodox churches. In the 1500s Western Christianity suffered a rupture that is commonly known as the Reformation. Out of that age has come a number of denominations that are collectively known as Protestant churches.

Both of these divisions within Christianity go against the very will of Christ, who on the night before he died prayed 'that all may be one as he and the Father are one'. [Jn. 17:21]

In the early 1900s an Episcopalian priest, Fr. Paul Wattson, who later became Catholic, began what has come to be known as the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. He chose the dates between January 18th and January 25th as an octave (8 days) of prayer. At that time January 18th celebrated the Chair of St. Peter (the primacy of Pope) and January 25th celebrates the Conversion of St. Paul and his mission to convert the Gentile world to Christianity.

The Vatican II [1962-65] document - <u>The Decree on Ecumenism</u> - begins with this statement, "The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council." In 1995 the late Pope John Paul II wrote an encyclical letter on ecumenism - <u>Ut Unum Sint</u> (That All May be One) - and states within it, "At the Second Vatican Council, the Catholic Church committed herself irrevocably to following the path of the ecumenical venture ..." {3}, and exhorts, "all the Catholic faithful to recognize the signs of the times and to participate actively in the work of ecumenism." {8}

Your prayers for the restoration of Christian unity are deeply appreciated.

2) January 22nd is the <u>48th anniversary</u> of two Supreme Court decisions that effectively legalized abortion in the United States of America.

Those two Supreme Court decisions {Roe v. Wade; Doe v. Bolton} have resulted in the death of over 60 million babies all in the name of 'freedom of choice'. That is 9 times the number of deaths attributed to the concentration camps of Nazi Germany during World War II or more than the present size of Italy's population.

Those Supreme Court decisions has galvanized the *Pro-Life Movement* in its defense of the life of the most vulnerable, the unborn, and its work of building a <u>culture of life</u> within a culture that often seems more comfortable with death and being 'a throwaway' society.

The United States Catholic Bishops have designated January 22nd as a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**. As individuals we are asked to observe this day through penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

Your prayers for the legal protection of unborn children are deeply appreciated.
