PASTOR'S NOTES

Year of St. Joseph

On December 8th of this past year Pope Francis asked Catholics throughout the world to dedicate this coming year (December 8, 2020 - December 8, 2021) to St. Joseph. This year will be the 150th anniversary of St. Pius IX's proclamation of Joseph as Patron of the Catholic Church.

With this declaration Pope Francis wrote an apostolic letter entitled *Patris Corde* which is translated **'With A Father's Love'**. As stated in this letter Pope Francis wants to "share some personal reflections on this extraordinary figure (Joseph) so close to our own human experience".

In that light Pope Francis sees Joseph as a person like many of us in these pandemic days whose "lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked". In a similar vein Joseph is "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble." For Pope Francis Joseph embodies and gives witness to many virtuous and zealous ways of Christian living.

With this understanding Pope Francis presents the fatherhood of Joseph under seven(7) titles:

1) a beloved father

Being the spouse of Mary and father of Jesus he places himself at 'the service of the entire plan of salvation'. He devotes himself completely to them in his life and work, especially to the Messiah who grows to maturity in his house. **Such is a beloved father**.

2) a tender and loving father

Beyond teaching Jesus to walk and bending down and feeding him as any tender and loving father does, salvation is worked through our weaknesses. Knowing his weaknesses, Joseph teaches us that faith in God includes believing He can work through fears, frailties and weaknesses all the while letting God steer the course. Such is a tender and loving father.

3) an obedient father

Four (4) times God reveals his plans to Joseph through dreams and Joseph always obeys. Just as Mary and Joseph obeyed all the prescriptions of Jewish law (e.g. - circumcision, Passover, etc.), Jesus comes to learn obedience, even 'obedience to death on the Cross'. **Such is an obedient father**.

4) an accepting father

Joseph exposes a spiritual path that is not one of explanation; rather one of acceptance. Joseph puts aside his own ideas and confronts reality with open eyes. Through such acceptance he catches a glimpse of a bigger picture, a broader history and life with a deeper meaning. Such is an accepting father.

5) a creatively courageous father

In accepting and embracing his personal history Joseph does not remain passive nor becomes 'a door mat'. When finding no room at the inn, Joseph finds a manger. When learning Herod seeks his son's life Joseph rises in the middle of the night and sets out on his flight to Egypt. Joseph believes that violence and force will not defeat God's saving plan. Such is a creatively courageous father.

6) a working father

Often known as Joseph the Worker, Joseph exemplifies and witnesses to Jesus the dignity of work. All dignified work participates in 'the work of salvation'. Work exists to serve humanity and build up the human community all the while hastening the coming of God's Kingdom. Such is a working father.

7) a father in the shadows

In all the many attributes of Joseph as a father, he "was the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father". As earthly father he introduces Jesus to life and reality, not to possess and control, but to bestow happiness that comes when one offers their life as self-gift. With this a father realizes "that he is most father and educator at the point he becomes 'useless' and sees his son become independent and knows his child is not his own, but merely one entrusted to his care". Such is a father in the shadows.
