## Epiphany – more than meets the eye

We are familiar with the story of magi following a star and bearing gifts of gold, myrrh and frank-incense to the Christ Child. **This story has become the liturgy celebrated on Epiphany.** It is a beautiful, sentimental story imbedded within the Christmas scene. But there is more here than initially 'meets the eye'. Epiphany is a theological story rich in the great truths found in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

First and foremost **the magi** in the Epiphany story represent the Gentile world (non-Jewish people) coming to worship a new born king of Israel. The Gentile world, unlike the Jewish nation, had not had the privilege of having had prophets announcing God's love affair with the human race. Yet here they come! The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the story of salvation for the whole world that will come to be in Christ's Death and Resurrection. As John's Gospel will say, "... anyone who accepts him, he empowered to become children of God." [Jn. 1:12]

In many ways **the star** of the Epiphany story confirms this. Abraham, the father of the Jewish faith, had been promised descendants as numerous as the stars of the sky. Now this secondary light of a star leads the magi to the true light of the world from whom the whole world will be 'born again'. The star also fore-shadows all of creation responding to the one born in Bethlehem. Beyond the twinkling of the star, Jesus will walk upon the waters and calm its waves [Mt. 14:25ff; Mk. 6:48], the sun will become darkened at his death [Lk. 23:44; Mk. 15:33], the earth will quake as he dies, rocks will be split asunder, and sheol will surrender its dead [Mt. 27:52]. The Christ Child is lord of heaven and earth. The Epiphany star is more than a celestial object or a stargazer's wonder.

The **gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh** also tell us who this Christ Child is. Gold represents a king, frankincense speaks of worship given to God, and the scent of myrrh will cover the smell of death, which all human beings will experience.

Such is the richness of the Epiphany story!

#### A Christmas reflection

The Church gives us the Christmas season as a time to reflect on the meaning and significance of God becoming man in Jesus Christ. Here is a quotation from a saint to aid our understanding of the Incarnation (God becoming man).

St. Hippolytus was a priest who lived between 170 and 236 AD. He was known for his great defense of Christianity in the throes of the Roman Empire. On one occasion he wrote, "We know that by taking a body from the Virgin he (Christ) refashioned our human nature. We know that his manhood was of the same clay as our own; if this were not so, he would hardly have been a teacher who could expect to be imitated. If he were of different substance from me, he would surely not have ordered me to do as he did, when by my very nature I am so weak. Such a demand could not be reconciled with his goodness and justice. No. He wanted us to consider him as no different from ourselves, and so he worked, he was hungry and thirsty, he slept. Without protest he endured his passion, he submitted to death and revealed his resurrection. In all these ways he offered his own manhood as the firstfruits of our race to keep us from losing heart when suffering comes our way, and to make us look forward to receiving the same reward as he, since we know we possess the same humanity.
