### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

### Why baptism for Jesus? - He is sinless!!

For most Christians baptism is associated with the removal of original sin from our souls. Today's feast celebrates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan river. **But Jesus is God and sin can have no part of God. So why did Jesus get baptized? He is sinless and has no need of baptism!** Let us remember John preached a baptism of repentance, not the removal of original sin. The grace of removing the stain of original sin only comes after Christ's Death & Resurrection, his Ascension into heaven and the bestowal of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. A point to be made is that whenever there is God-ward movement of people, God will be present in their midst. Therefore, Jesus is at the Jordan river as John the Baptist calls people to repent of their sins. The Church notes a number of points to be found in this feat of the Baptism of the Lord:

- > Christ's Baptism professes his solidarity with the human race including the sin we bear because of our descent from our first parents and their Fall from grace. (In essence, this becomes the overarching mission of Christ the restoration of the likeness of God that was lost by the sin of Adam and Eve.)
  - As St. Cyril of Alexandria writes, "In a plan of surpassing beauty the Creator of the universe decreed the renewal of all things in Christ. In his design for restoring human nature to its original goodness, he gave a promise that he would pour out on it the Holy Spirit along with his other gifts ... for the Father is to accept us in Christ as his adopted children ... He (Christ) receives it (the Spirit) to renew our nature in its entirety and to make it whole again."
- > Christ's baptism reveals the fact of <u>Christ's divine sonship</u> when the Father's voice declares, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
- > Christ's Baptism in the waters of the Jordan river <u>makes all the waters of baptism holy</u>.
  - As St. Maximus of Turin declares, "Christ is baptized not to be made holy by the water, but to make the waters holy... For when the Savior is washed, all water for our baptism is made clean, purified at its source for the dispensing of baptismal grace to the people of future ages."
- > Beyond the Father's voice **Christ's baptism** includes the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove. This suggests the <u>appointment and anointing</u> (commissioning) of Christ who, in turn, will now begin his public ministry in the land of Israel. (In effect this feast concludes the Christmas season and is the transition feast into Christ's 3-year public ministry and mission of redeeming the human race culminating in his death, resurrection, ascension and the sending forth of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

### Thank you, Matthew

Our seminarian, Matthew Kensok, will be returning to Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Maryland this week for the second semester of his third year of theological formation. If all goes well, Matthew will be ordained a transitional deacon this coming June and ordained a priest in June of 2022.

During his time here from Thanksgiving to mid-January, Matthew was involved in a number of pastoral works (e.g. - training Mass servers, teach RE classes, cantoring for Mass, reading, held an Advent Bible Study, helping clean and prepare a house for sale of an elderly widow, doing liturgical decorations, attended parish meetings, worked on Baptismal Anniversary cards, recorded names in a marriage book from 1908-1965, etc.). We certainly hope this has been a good experience in his pastoral formation. Please keep Matthew in your prayers and once again, Matthew – thank you for your presence and help. It has been great!
