This week's Stewardship moment:

"John answered them all, 'I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit..." \sim Luke 3:16

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus — the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Why baptism for Jesus? - He is sinless!!

For most Christians baptism is associated with the removal of original sin from our souls. Today's feast celebrates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan river. But Jesus is God and sin can have no part of God. So why did Jesus get baptized? He is sinless and has no need of baptism!

If we read the story of Jesus' baptism, John the Baptist insists that Jesus should baptize him; yet Christ insists that John baptize him. In turn the Church notes a number of points in this feast of the Baptism of the Lord:

- 1) **Christ's baptism** reveals the fact of Christ's divine sonship when the Father's voice declares, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
- 2) Beyond the Father's voice **Christ's baptism** includes the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove. This suggests the appointment and anointing (commissioning) of Christ who, in turn, will now begin his public ministry in the land of Israel. (In effect this feast concludes the Christmas season and is the transition feast into Christ's 3-year mission of redeeming the human race culminating in his death, resurrection, ascension and the sending forth of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.
- 3) **Christ's Baptism** professes his solidarity with the human race including the sin we bear because of our descent from our first parents and their Fall from grace. (In essence, this becomes the overarching mission of Christ the restoration of the likeness of God that was lost by the sin of Adam and Eve.)
 - As St. Cyril of Alexandria [374-444] writes, "In a plan of surpassing beauty the Creator of the universe decreed the renewal of all things in Christ. In his design for restoring human nature to its original condition, he gave a promise that he would pour out on it the Holy Spirit along with his other gifts ... for the Father is to accept us in Christ as his adopted children ... He (Christ) receives it (the Spirit) to renew our nature in its entirety and to make it whole again."
- 4) Christ's Baptism in the waters of the Jordan river makes all the waters of baptism holy.
 - As St. Maximus of Turin [380-465] declares, "Christ is baptized not to be made holy by the water, but to make the waters holy... For when the Savior is washed, all water for our baptism is made clean, purified at its source for the dispensing of baptismal grace to the people of future ages."

Student Stewardship - Slipping, slipping ...

In 2016 our **student's** Sunday Offertory collection for St. Leo's parish averaged \$11.86 per student for that year. Eight years later *(this past year 2024)* and with 30 more students, our student Sunday Offertory giving has disappointedly slipped to \$4.45 per student.

Parents we can use your help in this matter. This past week all St. Leo's RE students received a packet of Sunday Offertory envelopes for 2025. If each student were to give 25 cents per week during the course of this year, we would collect over \$2000. *Please remember* – all money collected in student Offertory envelopes is sent to the mission work that goes on in Chimbote, Peru, South America. **Again thank you parents** for reminding your student(s) to use their Sunday Offertory envelopes, which helps some of the poorest people in the world.

A note – if your child forgets to bring their Sunday Offertory envelope from home when they come to church, there is a basket of generic children envelopes on the shelf behind the last pew at the back of the church for your child's use. Just have them write their name of that envelope.
