

Events of Note

> <u>Wednesday, January 22nd</u> – Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

Over the last number of years the United States Catholic Bishops marked January 22nd as a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.** January 22nd had been the infamous day in 1973 when the Supreme Court had legalized abortion in America.

Since the Supreme Court overturned the 1973 *Roe vs. Wade* decision in June 2022, a political firestorm has erupted in this country. Now each of the 50 states are enacting laws regarding the issue of abortion. Some states are outlawing the practice of abortion while others are writing 'the right to abortion' into their state laws. It is obvious the pro-life movement has a long ways to go in cultivating a respect for the life of unborn children in the hearts and minds of millions of Americans. Prayer is a good place to start and it is that spirit that drove the United States Catholic Bishops to set aside a day for such prayer. *Perhaps you could attend daily Mass, pray a Rosary, pray the Stations of the Cross, make a Holy Hour, pray the Divine Mercy chaplet, make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament* – all in the spirit of converting hearts and minds to the gift of unborn life that is threatened by the barbarism of pro-abortion policies and misguided politicians.

> Wednesday, January 22nd - Ecumenical Prayer & Songfest at 6:45 p.m.

Each year the Church celebrates an octave of days (8 successive days) for the restoration of Christian Unity. These 8 days fall between January 18 and January 25. The feast day of January 25th celebrates the conversion of St. Paul and his life and ministry of taking the Gospel to the non-Jewish world. That Gospel has Jesus emphatically praying that *'all may be one as he and the Father are one* (Jn. 17:21).'

Ecumenism is the work of restoring Christian unity and an essential ministry of the Church. In our small way the Casselton Area Ministerial Association (CAMA) is sponsoring a time of ecumenical prayer and song **on Wednesday, January 22nd at 6:45 p.m. at St. Leo's Church.**This prayer service will be followed with refreshments in the Spirit of Life Center at about 7:30 p.m.

Since the parents of our RE students will be picking up their students at that time, **I highly encourage their attendance and all parishioners** for this time in which we pray for the restoration of Christian unity!
