PASTOR'S NOTES

Word of God Sunday — Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

On September 30, 2019 Pope Francis declared the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time to be celebrated as *Word of God Sunday*. September 30, 2019 was the 1600th anniversary of the death of St. Jerome, who translated the Hebrew language of the Old Testament and the Greek language of the New Testament into the Latin language. That Latin Bible became known as the Vulgate Bible, which was the gold standard of biblical translations until the 1500s when vernacular translations came on to the scene. It is St. Jerome, who declared, "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ".

In declaring the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as *Word of God Sunday* Pope Francis reminds us that the relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to Scripture, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth; without the Scriptures the mission and ministry of Jesus would remain incomprehensible.

In his Declaration Pope Francis speaks of the place of Scripture in our lives —

"Since faith comes from hearing and what is heard is based on the word of Christ, believers are bound to listen attentively to the word of the Lord, both in the celebration of the liturgy and in their personal prayer and reflection."

On the journey to Emmaus Jesus explain the Scripture and that journey "ended with a meal" ... (this) clearly demonstrate the unbreakable bond between sacred Scripture and the Eucharist."

"Apart from the Scriptures, (Christ's) death and resurrection can not be rightly understood."

Ecumenically "Scripture points out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity."

"Scripture belongs above all to those called to hear its message and recognize themselves in its word."

As St. Paul tells Timothy, "all Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." [2 Tim. 3:16]

May the Word of God Sunday remind us of the nearness and dearness of Holy Scripture.
