FREEDOM — a true understanding

As the Fourth of July rolls around, Americans will celebrate almost 250 years of freedom from the rule of King George III. The American colonists saw themselves enslaved to having a British standing army on its soil, laws regulating shipping and having to pay taxes on things like tea all without any representation. Of course all of this led to the Revolutionary War. We Americans see and understand this war as our fight for political freedom. Beyond political freedom there are all sorts of other freedoms: religious, speech, press, bear arms, peaceful assembly, etc.

What is a true understanding of freedom? When young people are asked to define or explain freedom they often respond that it is about 'doing what they want'. Is that freedom or slavery?

'To do what one wants' would suggest freedom and free choice are the same thing! Freedom would simply be the exercise of free choice. But, are not there such things as bad choices or wrong choices? What makes for a good choice or a right choice? There must be a set of norms for what is true, good and right. Therefore good choices would flow from these norms.

In the 8th chapter of John's Gospel Christ declares he has come to set people free. The people protest by saying they have never been slaves to anyone because they are descendants of Abraham. Christ speaks of slavery to sin and that their real father is the devil. These powerful words remind us that sin is very deceptive. It hides truth and makes evil appear as good. In a sense history is a story of evil worming its ways into cultures and personal lives distorting what is right, true and good. St. Paul understands the essence of this struggle when he writes to the Galatians, "*It was for freedom that Christ freed us. So stand firm and do not take on yourselves the yoke of slavery a second time*" [Gal. 5:1]. For St. Paul Christ is the only true measure of what is right, true and good. In John's Gospel Christ declares the he is "*the way, the truth and the life*" [Jn. 14:6]

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "... freedom is the power rooted in the intellect and the will ... a force for growth and maturity in truth and goodness; it attains its perfection when directed towards God..." [CCC 1731]. This would mean **truth precedes** any true exercise of freedom. Freedom flows from truth. True freedom exists only in the choosing of that what is true.

Freedom is not about a person 'doing what they want'. That kind of freedom is slavery. The very wisdom of God is inscribed in all that God has created and over which he has given us stewardship. Our dominion over the 'birds of the air and the fish of the sea' arises out of us discovering that wisdom. In our present culture we have created false claims to dominion over our bodies, the rule of money, and relationships between the sexes that simply fly in the face of what God has revealed as the way, the truth and the life.

Free people live to give honor and glory to God. Happy Fourth of July weekend!


