PASTOR'S NOTES

Congratulations — Deacon Matthew Kensok

A most sincere congratulations to Matthew Kensok on his ordination to the transitional diaconate this past Friday evening [June 4th], and who is assisting at today's [June 6th] Sunday Mass as a deacon at both St. Thomas and St. Leo's parish. Tonight (June 6th) Deacon Matthew will be leading a Holy Hour of **Exposition, Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. at St. Leo's Church.** Everyone is invited for this hour of prayer with Lord as Jesus encouraged his own disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane [Mt. 26:40].

Ordination is always a time of great joy to the parish from which comes the newly ordained. The last priest to be ordained for the Diocese of Fargo from St. Leo's parish was Fr. Richard Sinner, who was ordained a deacon on June 2, 1951. That is 70 years ago! Some might say 'we are due' for another one. **Thanks for saying 'Yes', Matthew.**

An ordination does not happen in a bubble nor in some isolation chamber. In the case of Matthew he comes from a wonderful family where the gift of faith was richly nourished by parents, Terry and Shari, along with his two sisters, Amanda and Elizabeth.

Of course many other individuals and communities have had a hand in shaping Matthew's life to this point in time — St. Leo's parish, Central Cass school, the city of Casselton, NDSU and its Newman Center, St. Gregory the Great seminary in Nebraska, family and friends, etc. God's providential care and love works in and through many ways and peoples.

For the next couple of months Deacon Matthew will be getting parish life experience at Sts. Anne & Joachim parish in Fargo under the tutelage of its pastor — Fr. Paul Duchschere. In mid to late August Deacon Matthew will be returning to Mt. St. Mary Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland for his final year of formation before being ordained priest for the Diocese of Fargo a year from now. That means — *a year from now* — Fr. Matthew Kensok will be celebrating his first Mass with us at St. Leo's. From then on and hopefully for many years thereafter he will be serving the People of God in the Diocese of Fargo in many priestly capacities. In that great hope and for our part let us keep Deacon Matthew in our prayers in this final year of priestly formation.

Enclosed in the bulletin is a prayer card acknowledging Matthew's diaconate ordination along with a short biography of his life. Also, available is a small pamphlet written by Matthew this past December and January outlining his own call to the priesthood and the various component parts of what goes into forming a young man during his years of seminary formation and living at a seminary. It is a very well written document and I encourage you to take one if you have not done so yet.

Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today's solemnity of the <u>Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ</u> has a very deep history in the life of the Church.

Its present manifestation began with a vision to an Augustinian nun in 1209 in Liege, Belgium with the Lord desiring a feast celebrating the Eucharist within the Church's annual cycle of feasts. The bishop of Liege introduced such a feast in 1246 and by 1264 it was extended to the whole Church. It was originally titled <u>Festum Ss. Corporis Christi</u> [Feast of the Most Holy Body of Christ] and eventually became titled <u>Ss. mi</u> <u>Corporis et Sanguinis Christi Solemnitas</u> [Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ].

But the Church's deep reverence of the Eucharist certainly predates the 1200s. In his letter to the Corinthians [1 Cor. 11:26] St. Paul reiterates the very words Christ used at the Last Supper and the fact that we are to do this in remembrance of him (Christ). In doing so, we "*proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes.*" Since Christ's death is a saving death, the Eucharist is a mystery of the deepest measure containing salvation itself in its proper celebration.
