PASTOR'S NOTES

'Starting off on the right foot'

The 40-day Lenten season begins this Wednesday with the mark of ashes and the prophet Joel asking us to return to the Lord with our whole heart, while St. Paul will remind us to "not receive the grace of God in vain" and Matthew's Gospel has Jesus speaking about true praying, fasting and almsgiving.

Forty (40) is a classic number in Scripture. It signifies a time in which a change or transformation unfolds in the lives of those who fruitfully engage this time of forty. In 40 years the Israelites were formed into God's Chosen People through their Exodus journey. After 40 days and nights in the desert Jesus emerges victorious over Satan. Spending 40 days and nights with God on Mt. Sinai Moses delivers the Ten Commandments to God's people [Exodus 34:28]. Elijah walks for 40 days and nights to Mt. Horeb as he receives his call to be a prophet for God's Chosen People [1 Kings 19:8].

For us Lent is meant to be our experience of forty (40) – encountering God in deep and abiding ways, by returning to the Lord [the prophet Joel], of entering his grace [the apostle Paul], of intensifying our prayer, fasting and almsgiving [the Gospel of Matthew].

St. Leo's and St. Thomas parishes attempt to assist its people in their 40 days by helping them to: **grow in prayer:**

- attend & celebrate Ash Wednesday liturgy;
- attend & celebrate a daily Mass in addition to Sunday Mass;
- weekly praying the Stations of the Cross;
- weekly Sunday evening Lenten Ecumenical Prayer Services;
- attending & celebrating all Holy Week liturgies;
- celebrate God's loving mercy through a Lenten Reconciliation Service

serve others through almsgiving:

- phone calls, visits, cards to persons home-bound, in hospital or nursing homes;
- strive for sacrificial giving in your Sunday Offertory giving;
- support the Ash Wednesday collection;
- support the Lenten canisters;
- support the Holy Thursday collection;
- support God's Gift Appeal

enter the discipline of fasting:

- fast from the capital sins [pride, anger, envy, greed, lust, sloth, gluttony];
- honor Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as days of <u>fast</u> (only one full meal with the other two being much smaller) and <u>abstinence</u> (no meat);
- honor the Fridays of Lent as days of abstinence;
- offer a personal sacrifice of some amenity in your life

Forty (40) faithful days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are meant to put us in communion with Christ who had a living relationship with the Father {prayer}, gave his life for the world {almgiving} and said "not my will but yours be done" {fasting}.

Such is Lent! May your Lent 'start off on the right foot'.
