Likewise, God's blessings to us may change over the years but it is important to trust that God will always provide us with all that we need.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Reconciliation — the pearl of great price

The Gospel story of the Prodigal Son is one of Christ's best known parables. It speaks richly of God's extravagant love in the face of human pride, anger and brokenness. **This classic story embodies the sacrament of Reconciliation.** The story begins with the sin of a family being set apart from one another; followed by an awareness of one's life being deeply scarred by the destructive power of sin **(examination of conscience)**; followed by a welling up of sorrow **(contrition)**; followed by a verbalization of irresponsible actions **(confession)**; followed by forgiveness and the new beginning of life **(absolution + penance)**.

As you remember the youngest son sought his inheritance early, left his father and family for a far-off land where he wasted his inheritance on raunchy living. Scripture say, 'he came to his senses' and returned home a repentant son. In turn, his father restored him to sonship and celebrated with the fattened calf.

It seems the key line in the story of the prodigal son is – "coming to his senses". In coming to his senses he remembers what he had learned from his days of religion – that God's mercy trumps justice! Human justice would say he only deserved to be treated like one of the hired workers. But he places his hope in what he had been taught to believe and returns home to experience a lavishness he would never had expected. This is what Christ teaches – God's merciful love is without limit (e.g.- 7 times 70 times forgiveness).

'Coming to his senses' is a code word for examining one's conscience. **Conscience is that voice of God** that lies within each of us calling us to virtuous living and holiness of life. <u>It is the voice</u> of the 10 Commandments and the Beatitudes. <u>It is the voice</u> of the Gospel parables and healing miracles. <u>It is the</u> <u>voice</u> of Christ's forgiving love as he hangs upon the Cross. <u>It is the voice</u> of God's Church and its many teachings about the treasures of the sacraments, the sanctity of life, the sacredness of sexuality, the stewardship of resources, the beauty of truth and the glory of love.

When we violate the voice of the Lord we find ourselves in far-off lands like the prodigal son. When we 'hit the wall' this voice of God is often awakened making us aware of our sinful ways. This voice also reminds us of God's relentless love in the face of sin. Our confession of sinful ways and disgraceful living unleashes the wellspring of the Father's merciful love. This dynamic of contrition, confession, absolution and penitential resolve to live differently is the very dynamic of the sacrament of reconciliation.

But, there is also the story of the older son in the story of the Prodigal Son where self-righteousness has blinded him from seeing his contempt for his father, his hatred for his brother, and replacing grace-filled religion with secular notions of justice and rationalizations. Failing to 'come to his senses' he lives in a far-off land and the cesspool of sin.

Blessed is the younger son who 'came to his senses', acknowledges his deviant ways, confesses his sins, and receives an abundance of new life (i.e., sandals for his feet, a ring for his finger and a cloak for his back). He discovered the 'pearl of great price'.

Blessed are they who avail themselves to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The dates and times of area Lenten Reconciliation Services are posted on the church's bulletin board, as well as ½ page hand outs in this week's bulletin, and on the shelves behind the last set of pews at the back of St. Leo's church or on the entry way table at St. Thomas.

St. Leo's Lenten Reconciliation Service is scheduled for Friday, April 11th at 7 p.m. There will be five (5) priests to hear confessions and bestow the absolution of the Lord's merciful love.
