PASTOR'S NOTES

Graduation

We extend our sincere congratulations to those who have graduated from Maple Vally and those who will be graduating from Central Cass. Graduation is a time filled with all sorts of emotions –

<u>Thankfulness</u> for all who have fed into this milestone in one's life – family, friends, teachers, church, etc. Graduation is a time to give thanks for those who have fed a person's spirit with virtuous and faithful living, for those who have challenged one's minds to seek the truth where it may be found, for those who have shaped a person's heart and mind to live for God.

<u>Hope</u> – to do great things, to be faithful to all that is true and to leave the world a better place by enriching the lives of others. Perhaps graduation is that time when the best things a person can do is to renew one's covenant (relationship) with God. In the Old Testament, Joshua graduated into leadership after the death of Moses, and after having lived a long life he speaks that life is a great choice between serving God or other gods. Joshua says, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." [Joshua 24:15] I pray graduation will be the same for our graduates – a life serving the Lord will all their hearts, will all their minds, with all their strength.

Memorial Day

Since 1971 the last Monday in May is celebrated and known as <u>Memorial Day</u> — a day to remember and honor those people who have died serving in the United States Armed Forces. Before 1971 Memorial Day had been celebrated on May 30th, but in 1968 Congress passed legislation moving 4 holidays from their traditional dates to a Monday so as to create a convenient 3-day holiday.

There is dispute as to the place of origin for this holiday, but it began in earnest after the Civil War in the 1860s with numerous celebrations honoring the 600,000+ soldiers who died serving both the Union and Confederate causes. In those earlier days **Memorial Day was known as Decoration Day** because of the placement of small flags and/or flowers on the graves of those who have fallen in battle in service of their country.

Memorial Day remembers the sacrifice of men and women for the causes of freedom, justice and peace. As some have said - the sacrifice of war and the 'baptism of blood' that happens on battle-fields foster bonds of brotherhood between peoples and ethnic groupings. In these very real ways Memorial Day carries with it religious themes that cut across denominational boundaries and calls the world to live in peace and be peace-makers!

On this Memorial Day and in its spirit let us recall with honor and respect those who died serving the greater cause of peace, justice and freedom and securing us from the vileness of tyranny, oppression and evil.

Mass on Memorial Day (Monday, May 31st) will be at 9:00 a.m.
