Transitional Deacon – what's that?

On Friday, June 4th our parishioner and seminarian, Matthew Kensok, will be ordained as a transitional deacon for the Diocese of Fargo. **Exactly -- what is a transitional deacon??**

First, the word 'ordination' refers to the sacrament of Holy Orders. Secondly, the sacrament of Holy Orders is the only sacrament that is plural (it is Holy Orders, not Holy Order), which means there is more than one order in this particular sacrament. In fact there are three (3) ranks or levels to the sacrament of Holy Orders. The first rank is deacon; the second rank is priest; and the third rank is bishop, which is the fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders. The three ranks are related to one another, but at the same time, are distinct from one another. In terms of the Eucharist – a deacon is the Ordinary Minister (distributor) of Holy Communion; a priest and bishop are ones who can consecrate the Eucharist; but a bishop is the only one who ordains both a priest and a deacon.

As a deacon (the first rank) one is either a permanent deacon or a transitional deacon. A permanent deacon can be married and his intention at ordination is to always live in the role of a deacon. On the other hand, a transitional deacon can not be married and is ultimately seeking to be ordained to the priesthood (the second rank).

Deacons (either permanent or transitional) can celebrate two of the Church's 7 sacraments. A deacon can baptize, and solicit the consent and witness the vows of a couple desiring to be married. In addition deacons can proclaim the Gospel, preach, preside at funeral burial services, bless certain religious objects, celebrate the exposition and benediction of the Eucharist, etc.

At their ordinations deacons become clerics in the Church and are incardinated into a diocese. According to the Church's canon law incardination means 'the permanent attachment of bishops, priests and deacons to a particular church for the primary purpose of the service of the people of God'. In a deacon's ordination ritual, they will make a promise of obedience to their bishop, to celebrate faithfully the liturgy of the hours for the Church and the world, be vested in a stole and dalmatic and presented with the Book of the Gospels. Particular to the ordination of a transitional deacon is his commitment to celibacy. In church usage celibacy is forgoing the dignity of married life and living a life of chastity. The bishop asks the transitional deacon: "In the presence of God and the Church, are you resolved, as a sign of your interior dedication to Christ, to remain celibate for the sake of the kingdom, and in lifelong service to God and mankind? The candidate answers: I am.

Perhaps this is more than what you wanted to know, but with Matthew's ordination to transitional deacon on the horizon, I thought it would be good to inform the parish of what it means to be a transitional deacon.

After his ordination on Friday, June 4th Matthew will assist as a deacon at Mass on Sunday, June 6th both at St. Thomas and St. Leo's as well as proclaim the Gospel and preach the homily. The 10:30 Mass at St. Leo's will be followed by an egg-bake breakfast for Matthew and the parish hosted by our Knights of Columbus. This is a great gift for St. Leo's parish to have one of our own ordained for the service of the Church here in eastern North Dakota. Next year we look forward to his ordination to the priesthood.

During the course of this upcoming summer Matthew will serve as a deacon at Sts. Anne and Joachim Church in Fargo before returning to his final year of seminary formation at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

Let us keep Matthew in our prayers!
