A COVID Thanksgiving

It seems to me the 2020 Thanksgiving finds us fearful, suspicious and unthankful. We do not know what the next day will bring. Over 250,000 lives have been lost in the United States alone. Hundreds of thousands of persons have caught the disease – *some have weathered it well; others have struggled mightily*. Jobs have been lost. Businesses have been shuttered. We are isolated from one another. Ordinary routines have changed dramatically or have become non-existent. Deaths, disruptions and dysfunction seem to define Thanksgiving 2020.

Perhaps, upon another reflection, there are some things for which to give thanks:

- (1) we had a good harvest and harvest season. Yields were good. Markets are operating. Field work is pretty much complete. **Thank you, Lord.**
- (2) the health care workers in this country and throughout the world have stood in the breach and have done a marvelous job of providing care and comfort in these most trying of times. **Thank you, Lord.**
- (3) scientist have 'stepped to the plate' and unleashed their skill sets in developing vaccines that are on the verge of being distributed and hopefully contain this virus over the course of these next few months. **Thank you, Lord.**
- (4) Again we have learned we are not in charge. Something we can not even see with the naked eye has taught us the fragility of life and the limits of being 'too big for our britches'. **Thank you, Lord.**
- (5) besides not being in charge we have learned not to take things for granted. All is gift and gifts need to be acknowledged and respected. We can not assume they will always be there at our beck and call. **Thank you, Lord.**
- (6) We have learned to be attentive to others and their needs, especially the most vulnerable, and so avoid thoughtless behaviors. **Thank you, Lord.**

Each church year ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King with the following Sunday being the First Sunday of Advent, which begins a new church year.

During each church year we travel anew through the mysteries of Christ's life and God's love for His People. Each church year is marked by various season lasting varying lengths of time: <u>Advent</u> (4 weeks); <u>Christmas</u> (2/3 weeks); <u>Lent</u> (5 weeks); <u>Holy Week/Triduum</u>; <u>Easter</u> (7 weeks); <u>Ordinary Time</u> (33/34 weeks). The Solemnity of Christ the King ends the period of time or season known as Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time we are called to live out the life of the Holy Spirit that was bestowed on history and humanity at Pentecost.

The life of faith is so deep and rich that one can never probe its fullness and treasure. The best we can do is to continually revisit what God has revealed in the life of his son, Jesus Christ, and his desire to form us in being the Body of Christ. The seasons of the church year becomes the lens by which our minds are given insight and our hearts give themselves in faith to the triumph and glory of what God has done for us in Christ Jesus.

In <u>Advent</u> our hearts and minds are prepared for God's coming in flesh and blood (<u>Christmas</u>). The love of God enters death on our behalf (<u>Lent</u>) and rises gloriously to eternal life (<u>Easter</u>) calling us by communion with and through the Holy Spirit to the glory and majesty of **Life** without end, of **Truth** without blemish, of **Beauty** without equal, of **Love** without limit (<u>Ordinary Time</u>).

With this hope in heart and mind let us prepare ourselves to enter Advent praying 'O Come, O Come Emmanuel.


