#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### Welcome home, Matthew

Our seminarian, Matthew Kensok, will be home from the seminary and helping at both St. Leo's and St. Thomas parish from the beginning of December until the middle part of January 2021. During these six weeks Matthew will be hopefully getting some practical and pastoral experiences of parish life. He is presently attending Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland and is in his third year of theology studies and formation. Matthew will be ordained a transitional deacon this coming June (2021), and ordained to the priesthood in June of 2022.

This year Mt. St. Mary's Seminary started their school year earlier in August and did not take a Fall break. This has allowed those seminarians to get this 'six-week' break between Thanksgiving and mid-January. In turn, this has allowed seminarians to get some great experiences in the many aspects of parish life. Hopefully, these experiences will serve them well as they look forward to their days as a parish priest.

Do not be afraid to introduce yourself to Matthew (or even invite him to your home). He is looking forward to offering some Advent and Christmas reflections, doing a short Bible study, visiting and teaching RE classes, helping with liturgies, etc. **Welcome – Matthew!!** 

#### Advent — getting it straight ... doing it right

Of the five (5) seasons of the church year, Advent gets short shrift. It gets pushed out of the way as people make a mad dash for Christmas. The meaning and purpose of Advent is often never explored nor experienced. We have all learned from the world of medicine that having the right diagnosis makes all the difference in the world for the restoration of one's health. Knowing the place of Advent in the life of the Church is critical for living the life of the Church.

Advent begins the church year. **Advent is not Christmas!** Advent sets the stage for what is to come – *the gift of a Christmas Child whose life-giving death and resurrection will literally change time and history.* Advent is that time in which the human spirit ponders the question – Do I (we) really need such a child? How can a child change time and history?

In our absolute busyness we do not take time to ponder the full purpose of life and living. We get caught in the present moment and all its pressing needs – making a living, paying bills, seeking the good life, keeping up with the Jones', funding our leisures, insuring our retirements, besting our competitors, establishing connections, having the latest app, seeking the best deal, etc.

Whether we do any of this well or poorly, we are all going to die. Then what? That is where the season of Advent begins.

In this first Sunday of Advent the Gospel speaks of a gate of which a gatekeeper is to tend – to be on alert for the arrival of the master who has been traveling abroad. (*The presumed Master is Christ who is coming a second time*). In the first reading of this Advent Sunday Isaiah the prophet writes, "Would that you (*the Lord*) might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways!" This is in contrast with being 'like withered leaves who never call upon his name nor rouse themselves to cling to him' (*the Lord*).

This week's clarion call to be on 'Watch' will be followed by 'Repent' in Advent's second week, 'Make ready the way of the Lord' in Advent's third week, and 'Be not afraid' in Advent's last week when an angel comes to a virgin in a little known town called Nazareth. It is from there that salvation dawns upon human history.

Salvation comes to those who attend to (watch) the Master of time and history. They know they have fallen short (repent) of the Master's glory and make amends (make straight the way of the Lord). It is to these that God's glory comes and takes up residence (Be not afraid). Christmas can only really come to those who have attended to Advent!
