PASTOR'S NOTES

Advent — getting it straight ... doing it right!!

Each year the season of Advent, which begins a new church year, usually begins after Thanksgiving Day and every year the Advent season gets crushed by a culture that earlier and earlier each year uses the sights, sounds and smells of Christmas to bolster 'the bottom line'. All the while 'the reason for the season' recedes further and further into oblivion {just an ancient story about some baby being born long ago in some far-off place}.

Paradoxically this baby will become the 'bottom line' of all history and time, and as the Gospel reading on the first Sunday of Advent will tell us – **Stay awake ... Be prepared for his Second Coming!**

Without the footwork of Advent, Christmas becomes just another party day that quickly passes as we return to the same old routine – *working, brokering deals, attending games, snapchatting, googling, twittering, tweeting, facebooking, etc.* – *ad nauseum*!

Advent is the necessary antidote from the true meaning of Christmas being pilfering by a culture that finds itself lost in a wilderness of relativism and consumerism. Advent is about coming to know our need for a savior, heeding the Baptist's cry for repentance, and pondering an angel's greeting to a young virgin that nothing is impossible for God.

Only hearts and minds trained by Advent are capable of being a Christmas people.

{or perhaps said in another way}

Prolepsis is not a commonly used word, but it is something for which most of us are somewhat familiar. Prolepsis is the time between an already anticipated future event and its present ongoing reality. For example, if a person is sitting on a dock and they see it is raining in the near distance, it is probably fair to assume rain will soon be falling on the deck – *it is raining but not here yet*. Christ has come already, but not yet in his fullness! Such is proleptic time.

Advent is proleptic time. It bridges these two comings – recalling the First Coming 2000+ years ago all the while preparing for his future Second Coming.

To prepare well for the Second Coming we revisit the First Coming in order to assimilate and take on a spiritual life that will form us anew into the 'image and likeness' of God that was deeply tarnished by the sin of our first parents in the garden of Eden, but was fully restored in the person of Christ. By taking on our human nature *{the Christmas mystery}* Christ came so we would come 'to know God's love', to be our 'model of holiness' and made us 'partakers of the divine nature'. For those graced with eyes to see and minds to understand, Christ redeemed the human race. To prepare for such a wondrous event is the 'heart and soul' of the Advent season.

A well-conceived and well-lived Advent is the gateway to a true Christmas!!
