## **PASTOR'S NOTES**

## Living in the Fifth Transition

According to George Weigel we are living the fifth major transition in the history of the Catholic Church. Weigel is a prominent Catholic author and commentator on matters of faith and culture. In addition he has written a fairly definitive biography of the late Pope John Paul II (now St. John Paul II). Weigel was the major presenter at last week's Presbyterate Days in Jamestown. Presbyterate Days is an annual gathering of the priests of the Diocese of Fargo for some spiritual/theological education as well as information and updating about diocesan offices and programs and a state of the diocese talk by Bishop Folda.

In Weigel's assessment Catholic Church history can be broken down into 4 major periods of roughly 500 years each. We are now into the fifth major transition period.

The first 500 years finds the Church engulfed by the hostile Roman Empire and built itself around the proclamation that Jesus is Lord. Christians witnessed to a more humane standard of life. Women were not treated as property, unwanted children were not left abandoned and to die of exposure, the sick were not set apart and isolated from family. Within the course of 250 years 30 - 40% of the Mediterranean world was converted to Christianity.

**The next 500 years** saw the great intellectual flowering of the Church where biblical imagery and language gets translated into many of the doctrines and dogmas that define Christianity to this day. This was known as the age of the Church Fathers (*Patristics*) [e.g. - Sts. Augustine, Jerome, etc.].

**The third 500 years** is known as medieval Christianity where Christianity and society live as a cohesive whole. This period is often known as <u>Christendom</u>. This synthesis of religion and culture is marked by some great saints – St. Francis of Assisi, St. Thomas Aquinas, etc. – the great Gothic cathedrals, the beginning of the university system, etc.

**The fourth 500 years** was the age following the Protestant Reformation of the 1500s often known as the age of the Counter-Reformation along with the age of missionary activities throughout the world, the building of institutions for immigrant peoples, great devotional life among Catholics in parish churches, etc. The Church survived many attempts by nation and state governments to make the Church a servant of the State (e.g. - the French Revolution, the Kulturkampf of Germany, Communism, etc.).

We are now entering into the **fifth major transition of the New Evangelization**. This age really began with Pope Leo XIII, who reigned from 1878-1903 and saw the emergence of the modern world with the coming of the Industrial Revolution, urbanization, colonization, market and labor economies. For him the Church was to engage this world of science and technology and not reside in our rectories and institutions. Pope Leo XIII writes the first social justice encyclical on labor unions [Rerum Novarum]. The modern age has a lot of problems and the Church has a story to tell (the Gospel). This was the thrust of the Vatican II Council (1962-1965) and its hope of New Pentecost. Here we move into a deeper focus on the person of Christ and less on building and maintaining institutions. The Church must re-present the Gospel in a new way [the New Evangeliztion]. The Church does not have a mission to the world. The Church is a mission and the world is its territory.
