This week's Stewardship moment:

"So out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name." ~ Genesis 2:19

The creation story reminds us of two important points. First, since the start, God has put the entire world in our care. Second, stewardship has been around since the beginning of mankind, it isn't something recently invented by the Church. Just as past generations built our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue to nurture and develop these gifts for future generations.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Wounded, called to Integration

Each Fall the priests of the Diocese of Fargo gather for 3 days for a time of prayer, fellowship, formation aimed at developing our priestly lives, and time to review diocesan matters and concerns. This time is called **Presbyterate Days** and was held this past Monday through Wednesday noon at our Maryvale Retreat Center at Valley City.

This year's formation topic centered on the topic being called to live integrated lives of happy, healthy and holy priests. In order to do that well we probed the sufferings and wounds that can arise in our daily lives. Our presenters spoke of six (6) sufferings and seven (7) wounds.

The suffering of *discouragement* can lead to despair; the suffering of *loneliness* can lead to isolation; the suffering of *non-existence* can lead to worthlessness; the suffering of *compassion-fatigue* can lead to burn-out; the suffering of *doubt* can lead to anger, resentment and gossip; the suffering of *shame* can lead to pride and clericalism.

In turn, these kinds of sufferings can produce wounds in our lives. Left unattended, wounds become infectious and lead us to have false beliefs about life in general out of which we make false vows in terms of living and leading others.

The presenters named the following wounds: (1) abandonment {I am all alone; no one cares or understands me}; (2) fear {I am afraid; if I trust I will be hurt}; (3) shame {I am bad or stupid; because of what happened I will never recover; (4) powerlessness {I can't change; I am too small or weak}; (5) rejection {I am not loved, wanted nor desired}; (6) hopelessness {things will never get better; I just want to die}; (7) confusion {I don't understand what is happening}.

An integrated life means having self knowledge of oneself as a relationship between God, myself and others. Once a person has proper self knowledge one accepts oneself and takes possession of his/her gifts, strengths and weaknesses. In turn a person can give oneself as self-gift.

Obviously Presbyterate Days are directed towards priest, but these insights into sufferings and wounds can be seen in all of lives and today's cultural malaise. It seems the more we put ourselves out of contact with God the more our mental and social lives will suffer and be wounded. From there we will formulate false beliefs and make false oaths by enslaving ourselves to self-reliance, personal autonomy, technological solutions, etc., etc.

Integrated lives engage prayer, do daily examinations of conscience, engage healthy conflict, seek the counsel and advice of others, do formative reading, have friends and fraternity, etc. Together these activities are the ingredients of happiness, health, and holiness.

Respect Life Month

The Church has designated every October as Respect Life Month and the first Sunday of October is name Respect Life Sunday.

In so many ways our culture/our world is absolutely disrespectful of life:

- > there is the war on the unborn under the guise of reproductive rights;
- > there are the *publicized wars* in Ukraine and the Middle East plus the many *unpublicized wars* in forgotten places and among forgotten peoples;
- > there are countless refugees and immigrants seeking asylum from political violence and human trafficking;
- > there is disregard for the homeless, the hungry, the vulnerable, the intellectually disabled, the emotionally disturbed, those in foster care, etc.

There are so many we can take to prayer. The Diocese is hosting a Holy Hour for Life on this Sunday, October 6th at Sts. Anne & Joachim Church following a 12:30 p.m. Mass. All are invited to join in prayer for the Gift of Life.
