# **Redeemed Eucharistic Congress**

Diocese of Fargo – 6/7 September 2024 Annotated Review

As we enter this third and last year of the National Eucharistic Revival, the Diocese of Fargo hosted the **Redeemed Eucharistic Congress** in Jamestown this past September 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. A number of speakers gave testimony to the Eucharist. I was able to attend 3 of the talks – **two by Dr. Scott Hahn and one by Msgr. Tom Richter.** They were excellent. Dr. Hahn is a nationally recognized speaker on many Catholic topics. In a couple of weeks people will be able to review these talks on the diocesan web site. I thought I might give a review of Dr. Hahn's first talk titled *Road to Emmaus: Cultivating Eucharistic Amazement*.

The Emmaus story is found in Luke's Gospel [Lk. 24:13-35]. It takes place on Easter Sunday as two disciples are leaving Jerusalem on a 7-mile journey to Emmaus. They are despondent over Jesus' death and had just heard that Jesus' tomb is empty. They meet this stranger (who is really the risen Lord, but unrecognizable at that time). This stranger starts telling the disciples how all of this was part of God's larger plan of salvation. In fact all of this had been foreshadowed in the Scriptures. The stranger goes through Scripture looking at the Law, the prophets and the psalms.

Dr. Hahn's talk focused on what Scripture passages this stranger may have examined as pointing to Christ's Passion story. Some points that Dr. Hahn noted:

- > one of two disciples is names Cleopas; the other is unnamed *perhaps Luke intends us to be privy to this unfolding story;*
- > the story of Abraham and sacrifice of Isaac in Genesis 22 where Isaac carries the wood for his own sacrifice as Christ does to Calvary; the place of the sacrifice is called Moriah is this Golgotha in the story of Christ?;
- > the story of Moses and him needing to be saved before he saves the Israelites from their slavery in Egypt as infant Jesus is saved from Herod before he saves us on the Cross;
- > the story of the first Passover and sprinkling of the doors with lamb's blood by a hyssop as a hyssop with wine is given to Jesus on the Cross; Moses choosing 12 helpers in the desert as Christ chooses 12 apostles;
- > who is that suffering servant of which the prophet Isaiah 53 speaks? is this Christ's passion of scouring and crown of thorns before Pilate?
- > what is this new covenant of which the prophet Jeremiah spoke? [Jer. 31/32] is this the new covenant of which Christ speaks over the cup of wine at the Last Supper?
- > does the lament of Psalm 22 {"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me ..."} foreshadow the lament of Christ on the Cross? [Mt. 27:46; Mk 15:34]

The two disciples became amazed in this 7-mile bible study ('were not our hearts burning ") until they were literally 'blown away' when they recognized Christ in the breaking of the bread (just as he did at the Last Supper), and then he disappeared. Is this meant to teach us -- now we find the crucified and risen Lord in the Eucharist? We are called to cultivate our Eucharistic amazement as did the disciples on the road to Emmaus.

In his other talk Dr. Hahn spoke of us being in Exile until we reach heaven and the *Lord's Prayer* is our journey prayer. He gave a penetrating talk on the 7 petitions of the *Our Father*.

Msgr. Richter's talk challenged us that Sunday Mass Catholicism is no longer capable of passing on the faith. We are in deep need of three graces from the Holy Spirit: (1) a felt need of the Eucharist; (2) a relational prayer life with Jesus as a friend; (3) a more intentional sharing in Christ's sacrificial giving of self.
