PASTOR'S NOTES

Confirmation/Eucharist & the coronavirus

On Thursday evening we received a memo from the Diocese of Fargo stating all Confirmation/ Eucharist celebrations that Bishop Folda had scheduled for this spring have been cancelled. That means the Confirmation/Eucharist celebration that had been scheduled for Saturday, May 16th at St. Leo's has been cancelled.

What is the next step??

The memo notes that when we are given some direction to proceed safely with gatherings of some size, pastors can petition Bishop Folda to have themselves confirm their students or invite Bishop Folda to celebrate these sacraments, which would entail having some of these celebrations during the weekday and not on weekends.

Sue and I will be discussing this matter along with other pastors and parishes to see what plans they may have. Sue will certainly be in contact with the parents of our students to answer questions, listen to concerns and inform parishioners on how we will proceed.

In the meantime we will need to finish off some of the preparation requirements (e.g. - a parent class, interview times, student handbooks, etc.) Again Sue will be in touch with parents regarding dates, times and requirements. If you have questions do not hesitate to contact myself or Sue. Sue will also be in contact with parents of Reconciliation students with plans on how to finish their preparation and celebration of that sacrament.

St. Leo's church painting project

We have been able to schedule our painter beginning Monday, May 4th. We will begin in the nave of the church (i.e., where the pews are and the people sit).

On Saturday, May 2nd we plan on moving all the pews out of the church into the Spirit of Life Center. This will allow our painter free access to the church's interior (nave) for two weeks. Once the painter is done or near done our plans are to strip the flood, reseal and wax the floor of the nave. All in all, if things go well, the nave of the church will not have pews for two weekends (May 10th and May 17th) with the floor being finished and pews returned in place by May 20th.

Some bad news - our elevator

A little over a week ago our elevator maintenance man told us our elevator was shot. I had been told a number of years ago that our elevator was one of the last of its kind in this area and we should plan on replacing it since its operating electronic equipment would not be able to be replaced.

The Parish Pastoral Council decided to wait until it finally gave out and then replace it. We got an additional six years out of it, but now it needs to be replaced. I have received two bids on replacing it and the Pastoral Council will review the situation, review the proposals and decide on how to proceed.

The bad part about all of this is that it will take at least ten weeks, once we make a decision, before we will have an operational elevator. In the meantime we have a handicap ramp behind the rectory garage that allows access to the church and through the church to the office area and the Spirit of Life Center. We would have no handicap access to the church basement.

Psalm 137 - a prayer for our times

As this coronavirus continues to plague our lives perhaps a prayerful praying of Psalm 137 could be a helpful antidote. We are not the first people to yearn for a return to 'the ways things were'. Many of the people of Israel were exiled to Babylon for 50 years and this was one of their prayers as they languished in some desperate times.
