# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

## Why baptism for Jesus? - He is sinless!!

For most Christians baptism is associated with the removal of original sin from our souls. Today's feast celebrates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan river. But Jesus is God and sin can have no part of God. So why did Jesus get baptized? He is sinless and has no need of baptism!

If we read the story of Jesus' baptism, John the Baptist insists that Jesus should baptize him; yet Christ insists that John baptize him. In turn the Church notes a number of points in this feast of the Baptism of the Lord:

- 1) **Christ's baptism** reveals the fact of Christ's divine sonship when the Father's voice declares, *"This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."*
- 2) Beyond the Father's voice **Christ's baptism** includes the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove. This suggests the appointment and anointing (commissioning) of Christ who, in turn, will now begin his public ministry in the land of Israel. (In effect this feast concludes the Christmas season and is the transition feast into Christ's 3-year mission of redeeming the human race culminating in his death, resurrection, ascension and the sending forth of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.
- 3) **Christ's Baptism** professes his solidarity with the human race including the sin we bear because of our descent from our first parents and their Fall from grace. (*In essence, this becomes the overarching mission of Christ the restoration of the likeness of God that was lost by the sin of Adam and Eve.*)
  - <u>As St. Cyril of Alexandria writes</u>, "In a plan of surpassing beauty the Creator of the universe decreed the renewal of all things in Christ. In his design for restoring human nature to its original goodness, he gave a promise that he would pour out on it the Holy Spirit along with his other gifts ... for the Father is to accept us in Christ as his adopted children ... He (Christ) receives it (the Spirit) to renew our nature in its entirety and to make it whole again."
- 4) Christ's Baptism in the waters of the Jordan river makes all the waters of baptism holy.
  - <u>As St. Maximus of Turin declares</u>, "Christ is baptized not to be made holy by the water, but to make the waters holy... For when the Savior is washed, all water for our baptism is made clean, purified at its source for the dispensing of baptismal grace to the people of future ages."
