#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### Sin in our Church ... our culture ... our lives

The headline in Friday's *Fargo Forum* reads, "Confession of Sins". With that, the article goes on to relate that the Diocese of Fargo released the names of priests since 1950 who have had substantiated allegations of sexual abuse of minors leveled against them.

The list includes the name of 17 priests and 2 deacons who were ordained for the Diocese of Fargo. In addition there are the names of one religious brother, six religious order priests, and five priests from other dioceses, all of whom at one time or another had worked within the Diocese of Fargo. Truly these are remorseful days and a time of reckoning. Crimes of this nature are truly sinful and those found guilty of such abuse charges need to be fully prosecuted. Victims of such sinful behavior need to be fully helped in the rehabilitation of their lives.

With that being said and without fully knowing any of the details and the veracity of specific cases and charges, this crisis demands our fullest attention and procedures put in place to eliminate this cancer from our culture and our lives.

The news is full of accounts telling the pervasive nature of this crisis, which has enveloped politicians, ministers, teachers, business people, Hollywood moguls, Scout leaders, etc. No particular segment of society has been exempt from the tentacles of this disease and sickness.

We seem to be a culture living in a time when the whole world of sexuality is topsy-turvy! At one level almost anything short of full-blown pornography fills our airwaves and receives public acclaim (e.g. - 50 Shades of Gray). On another level there are multi-layered discussions and lawsuits on gender identity and transsexual experiences all claiming equality and normalcy in terms of sexual expression. On top of that individual and family lives are filled with the viewing of pornography, promiscuous behaviors, living together situations, sexually transmitted diseases, marital affairs, etc., all of which seem to be on the rise.

# Where do we go? How do we proceed in such a world?

Both the Vatican and the bishops of the United States are in the process of formulating processes and procedures to deal with bishops who themselves have abused others and/or have been truly negligent in their duties and responsibilities as 'shepherds' (e.g. - the Cardinal Theodore McCarrick case). Lay women and men will be more deeply involved from start to finish of judging allegations of abuse and the failure of church authorities to rightly 'shepherd' and care for the people under their pastoral watch. This will be a good step in the right direction.

This crisis will not be stemmed until we reclaim a true understanding of the sacredness of sexuality and its place in God's plan for men and women. Sexuality is not just another system within our bodies like the cardio-vascular system. It is not just something subject to technology, pills and medicine. Sexuality is a constitutive part of our identities. It defines us from the beginning of our existence. When this is wrongly understood and lived-out, we get in all sorts of trouble.

A good start would be parents taking the lead in living purely and chastely and passing on those virtues to their children. For our part, all of us can do our part by praying, offering prayers and seeking reconciliation for the times we have not lived our sexuality in ways intended by God. As the old saying goes, "A trip of a thousand miles begins with a single step."


