PASTOR'S NOTES

Prudence in the face of the coronavirus -

It would be hard to believe that most people have not heard of the coronavirus (COVID - 19). It has changed the present landscape of American life (e.g. - Wall Street, the world of athletics, etc.). This virus has circled the globe and affected many, many nations – *some more drastically than others*. This virus seems to have caught the medical world flat-footed. We are still not fully aware of its origin, nature and mode of transmission. Any vaccine solution is not immediately available and lies in the future. Some doctors are saying this virus is 10 times more deadly than the common flu virus. At this point prudence is the better part of valor.

Given these concerns, the liturgy office of the Diocese of Fargo forwarded a memo to all diocesan parishes regarding **temporary** common sense practices for avoiding the possible spread of this virus. As always the most obvious practice is proper hygienic protocol (e.g. - washing of hands, etc.).

With regard to the Mass other more <u>immediate and temporary</u> common sense practices include:

- > receiving Communion in the hand, rather than on the tongue, reduces the risk of transferring viruses;
- > temporarily suspending exchanging the Sign of Peace through physical contact like the shaking of hands;
- > temporarily suspending receiving the Precious Blood from a common cup, except for those who can not receive under the form of bread;
- > temporarily emptying the church's holy water fonts of holy water {parishioners are encouraged to take holy water bottles from our holy water reservoir and bless themselves at home};
- > suspending the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for persons who are ill including those who are elderly and suffer from a chronic medical condition; *if one is unable to attend Sunday Mass, join in spiritual communion with the parish by watching the televised Sunday Mass at 10:30 a.m. on either channel 6 {WDAY} or channel 8 {WDAZ}.*

Both St. Leo's and St. Thomas parishes will abide by these *temporary*, prudential practices until further notice.

This kind of illness reminds us our fragility as human beings, our finite natures and as our status as creatures in the grand design of things. In our multi-layered response to this disease, may prayer be a centerpiece in our daily lives. Prayer is not about informing God of this situation (God knows), but prayer attunes us to what God is saying to us in our deepest needs as his sons and daughters. It is not God's will to harm us, but to bend our hearts and minds to ways of living and love that seek what is true and what is good for the whole of the human race and not just our personal lives.
