PASTOR'S NOTES

Different, but deeply connected, days

On November 1st and November 2nd the Church celebrates two different, but very deeply connected, realities in our lives of faith.

Both of these days remind us that death will come to all of us. **What happens at death is not the same for everyone.** At the very moment of death a particular judgement will be rendered on each person's life:

- (1) "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are <u>perfectly purified</u> live forever with Christ" in **heaven** (CCC 1023);
- (2) "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still <u>imperfectly purified</u>" (CCC 1030) undergo purification in **Purgatory** so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven {Rev. 21:27};
- (3) For those who "die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love ... remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called **hell**." (CCC 1033)

November 1st celebrates All Saints Day, which is one of the five Holy Days in the United States (the other 4 being: January 1st - Mary, Mother of God; August 15th - Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven; December 8th - Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary; December 25th - Christmas). On the church calendar many days are designated as days of particular saints (e.g. - October 4th - St. Francis of Assisi; November 10th - St. Leo the Great; July 5th - St. Thomas the Apostle, etc.). But All Saints Day acknowledges there are many more saints than those officially recognized or listed on the church calendar. On November 1st we celebrate and seek the intercession of all holy men and women who live in heaven and the blessedness of God.

On the other hand, **November 2nd (All Souls Day)** is a day set aside for us to pray for deceased loved ones undergoing the purification of Purgatory. It is our offering of Masses, prayers and almsgiving that assist them in being purified from their vestiges of sin and help them attain their final glory of heavenly life and the beatific vision of God. These offerings of Masses, prayers and almsgiving are often called – 'suffrages'.

Both of these days (Nov. 1st and 2nd) acknowledge what the Apostles' Creed calls the 'communion of saints', which is another name for the Church. **The Church is comprised of three states of being:** (1) we, living on earth; (2) the saints in heaven; (3) the souls in purgatory. Because the Church is One there is a sharing of spiritual goods among these three states of the Church. We seek the intercession of those already in heaven (the saints) while they are always praying for us, and we offer prayers and alms for loved ones in purgatory who are constantly seeking/desiring our spiritual help. The Church as the 'communion of saints' is both a communion and a sharing in holy things and among holy persons.

Masses for All Saints Day, which is a Holy Day, will be at 5:30 p.m. at St. Thomas in Buffalo on Thursday, October 31st and at St. Leo's in Casselton on Friday, November 1st at 7 pm.

On All Souls Day {November 2nd} St. Leo's will host an Evening Prayer Remembrance Service in conjunction with our 5 p.m. Saturday evening Mass. All who have lost a loved one – this year or

in years gone by – are invited to attend this Mass/Remembrance Service. Praying for the living and the dead is a spiritual work of mercy. The service will be followed by a simple reception at the rectory.
