PASTOR'S NOTES

Pope Francis

~~~ a personal reflection ~~~

My priesthood has been lived under the tutelage of five (5) popes *(Paul VI; John Paul I; John Paul I; Benedict XVI and Francis)*. I was ordained during the final days of the papacy of Paul VI, who served as Pope for 15 years. This was followed by the one-month papacy of John Paul I. Then came the 27-year papacy of John Paul II, followed by 8-years of Benedict XVI and now the 12-years of Francis.

I did not personally meet any of these Popes, but their lives and papacies gave shape to my priesthood. **Paul VI** guided the Church through the implementation of the Second Vatican Council and the many structures that undergird church life today. **John Paul I** only served for 33 days dying 3 ¹/₂ months into my first year of priesthood while serving St. Michael's parish in Grand Forks. Then came the 27 year reign of **John Paul II**, who along with the 8 year papacy of **Benedict XVI**, left an abundance of deep theological writings on fundamental dimensions of human life and cultural issues (*e.g. - freedom, truth, love, etc.*). This was in addition to the second Catechism in the life of the Catholic Church along with a new Code of Canon Law under the oversight of John Paul II. Then Pope Francis was elected in 2013.

It seems to me Pope Francis' papacy was much more directed towards pastoral issues, i.e., to the lived experience of Catholics in the modern world. From the beginning he directed our attention to the poor and the marginalized, those who found themselves on the peripheries of life. It was very important to him that such people not be forgotten nor their voices be lost in the din of modern life and the hustle and bustle of materialism and consumerism. He was renown for his Holy Thursday footwashings of male and female prisoners and even those not of the Christian faith. The Church must always proclaim and be alive in the mercy of God.

In many ways this direction of church life was captured in his call for synodality in the Church where the voices of all members be heard. That spirit of synodality was accompanied by his encouragement to enter into **dialogue** with others. True dialogue leads people into **encountering** the deeper matters of heart and mind. From such encounters people **accompany** one another in the joys, challenges and tribulations of life. Dialogue, encounter & accompany were the passwords of his life.

Out of this perspective he often challenged church leaders and priests to have "the smell of the sheep", i.e., totally knowing the lived lives of the people they served. He frequently spoke forcefully against clericalism and church leaders and priests always looking for 'perks and privileges' and seeking power and status. He constantly reminded us – 'we were ordained to serve and give our lives for our people'.

In turn, this led Pope Francis "to see" the Church as a *field hospital*, i.e., serving on the front lines of a modern culture that is ill and broken in many ways. The Church should be a ready refuge for the immigrant and


refugee. The Church should speak courageously about economic injustice, the horror of war, caring for creation and ecology, the trafficking of human being, etc.

Pope Francis served the Church exquisitely. His voice and his presence was not always readily accepted. But in time, I believe, his vision of Church and church life will be seen as the prophetic voice of the Holy Spirit.

May he rest in peace and hear the Lord say — "Well done, good and faithful servant! Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the beginning of the world."
