This week's Stewardship moment:

"You too must be patient. Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand."~ James 5:8

Through daily prayer God reveals to us what He wants us to do with the gifts He has given us. We are able to better align ourselves with God's will and His plan, which is far better than anything we can come up with on our own.

PASTOR'S NOTES

'Prepare ye the way of the Lord'

This familiar phrase began long before John the Baptist was seen as that voice crying out in the desert. Six hundred years before John the Baptist or Christ lived, Isaiah the prophet used this line to encourage the people of Israel to get their lives in order.

In that same spirit John the Baptist called the people of his time to 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand'. Since the days of Isaiah God has had some unbelievable visions for his people — days when swords would be made into ploughshares and there will be no harm or ruin on all God's holy mountain.

This does not happen magically !!! First, God's people must desire and want this vision for themselves. Once it is ascertained that people desire this, then people must 'take stock of the their lives and come clean.' That is the heart of the Baptist's call for repentance. The real meaning of Christmas can not come and take up residence in unclean hearts and minds. Christ understands this dimension of human existence. He shared our human condition. He knows the power of temptation and the lure of the 'dark side'. He also knows the great mercy and love of his/our heavenly Father. For that very reason God left His Church the gift of his reconciling love in the sacrament of Reconciliation. On the very night of Christ's Resurrection, Christ's first public words to his apostles were, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men's sins, they are forgiven them; if you hold them bound, they are held bound."

In these last 11 days before Christmas, area Catholic churches are offering **Advent Reconciliation Services**. The list of times and places are included on the bulletin board in the church entry. You are certainly invited to make this part of your Advent preparation.

St. Leo's Advent Reconciliation Service is scheduled for Friday, December 19th at 7 p.m.
