PASTOR’S NOTES

Joining the Church

At the Church’s Easter Vigil Service (*on Holy Saturday night*) many Catholic churches throughout the world celebrate the entry of new people into the life and membership of the Catholic Church. These are people who have gone through a process now called **OCIA**. This is an acronym for **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**. It was previously known as RCIA [**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**].

For the past number of weeks six people from the parishes of St. Leo’s and St. Thomas have so far attended 12 of 16 classes on the Catholic Church and its teachings and beliefs. Two of these six would like to be fully initiated into the Church by being baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist. Such people are called **catechumens** as they go through OCIA. Four of the six have already been baptized in other Christian denominations and would like to be confirmed and receive the Eucharist. The OCIA process calls these persons **candidates for reception into full communion** with the Catholic Church.

Our catechumens are: **Don Krueger** and **Hunter Krueger**.
Our candidates are: **Hannah Barnes**, **Andrew Fraase**, **Jacob Schultz** and **Emma Weber**.

During these final weeks before Ash Wednesday they will finish their Inquiry classes. During the season of Lent they will finalize their final steps of full entry into the life of the Catholic Church that will be celebrated at our Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 4th.

Ecumenism – a work of discipleship

Over the course of the last 2000+ years of Christian history the Church of Jesus Christ has suffered two major breaches in its unity. One breach occurred in the 1000s and is known as the East-West split. This gave rise to what is known as Orthodox churches. Then in the 1500s the Western Church suffered what was known as the Protestant Reformation.

Breaches in Church unity are against the will of Christ. At the Last Supper Christ prayed *‘that all may be one as he and the Father are one’* [**Jn. 17:21**]. This prayer has given rise to a word called ecumenism. **Ecumenism is the work of restoring Christian unity.**

One of the 16 documents of Vatican II was the Decree on Ecumenism which opening line reads, *“The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council.”* In 1995 the late pope St. John Paul wrote, *“At the Second Vatican Council, the Catholic Church committed herself irrevocably to following the path of the ecumenical venture ...”*, and exhorts, *“all the Catholic faithful to recognize the signs of the times and to participate actively in the work of ecumenism.”* It is a source of joy to see that many ecumenical meetings almost always include and indeed culminate in prayer. *The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, celebrated in January ... has become a wide-spread and well established tradition.”*

In that spirit of ecumenism and the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**, the Casselton Ministerium will be hosting an Ecumenical Service of Song and Prayer **this coming Wednesday, January 21st, beginning at 6:45 p.m. at St. Leo’s**. All are welcome!!

The Icon up front

The Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the stand near Mary’s statue is part of the world-wide Knights of Columbus traveling pilgrim icon program that has happened annually since 1979. This icon is a reproduction of the 1767 painting by Pompeo Batoni and found in the Church of the Gesu in Rome. This icon carries the Apostolic blessing of the late Pope Francis.
