**Cost of Lighting a Votive Candle:** The cost of lighting a votive candle will be going up to \$5 per candle. A case of votive candles has gone up 70% in the last couple of years and as a result the church has ended up subsidizing votive candles by about \$500 a year. Therefore, we need to raise our price. Your cooperation in this matter is deeply appreciated.

**Confirmation 2026 Advance Notice:** This year St. Leo’s Confirmation Liturgy with Bishop Folda will be held on Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup> at the 5 pm Mass with 17 students being confirmed. There will be reserved seating for the Confirmation students and their families and the Mass will be longer than 1 hour and will have a bigger attendance than normal for a Saturday 5 pm Mass. For those who usually attend this Mass, you may want to attend one of the Sunday Masses that weekend (St. Leo’s– 8:30 am; St. Thomas– 10:30 am) given the limited amount of seating available at the 5 pm Mass.

**Lenten canisters:** It’s time to start preparing Lenten canisters for this year’s season of Lent. According to our records, the are about 50 canisters still that need to be returned. To help defray the cost of having to order canisters for this year, we are asking that if you have any old Lenten canisters at home if you could please return them as soon as possible. Each canister costs around \$2. Canisters can be returned to the church at anytime. Thank you.

St. Leo’s Annual parish meeting

This coming Sunday February 1<sup>st</sup> St. Leo’s parish will have its annual parish meeting after the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass. **This meeting is open to all parishioners of St. Leo’s parish.** It will begin with and free and very delicious meal. Younger children will be fed downstairs along with some entertainment so parents can participate in the meeting upstairs. ***Come with fellow parishioners and learn more about your parish!!***

Perhaps a little reflection on parish life is in order. Decades ago parish life played a central part in people’s daily lives. Spiritual and social activities were a commonly part of a church’s weekly life: there was the CYO for the youth, the Knights of Columbus for the men and altar societies and sodalities for women. **Obviously life has changed:** the explosion of social media, the ease of transportation, the all-encompassing place of sports, the rise of technology, etc. People find themselves going a thousand different directions. In all of this parish life has taken a hit! Yet when one thinks about it, the essence of parish life has maintained a steady core. For people of faith, parish life is structured around the essentials of the spiritual life.

- Lives of faith** need to be nurtured and lived in parishes that offer places to pray, to offer praise and worship: ***think*** — *Sunday & daily Masses, Saturday afternoon confessions, Advent & Lenten Reconciliation Services, Rosary recitations, quiet visits to the Blessed Sacrament, weddings, First Reconciliation Services, Holy Week, Lenten Stations of the Cross, Tenebrae Service, Confirmation & Eucharist for the first time, Living Stations of the Cross, etc.*
- Lives of faith** need to be formed in the depth and wisdom of God’s call to holiness and virtuous moral living: ***think*** — *Student Religious Education classes, literature rack in church entry, periodic Bible studies & adult education presentations, baptism classes, OCIA/RCIA classes for those joining the Church, special prayer and spiritual reading booklets for Advent, Christmas, Lent & Easter, diocesan retreats, etc.*
- Lives of faith** are called beyond themselves to the care of others in the many needs of the human condition and the building up of our faith community: ***think*** — *welcoming newcomers, Sunday beverage and bite, annual Fall Dinner, KC breakfasts, Lenten Fish Fry & Corn and Brat feed, Friday Lenten Soup & Sandwich, Cameroon Mission project, Giving Tree, Gifts for the Child, food collections, etc.*
- Lives of faith** know the certainty of death but bask in the promise of the resurrection and celebrate this belief in our care for the sick, the dying and our respect for the dead: ***think*** — *Anointing of the Sick, Communion to the homebound, hospital visitation, vigil (wake) services, funeral Masses, funeral receptions, etc.*
- Lives of faith** understand the need for facilities and the stewardship of finances to underwrite this enterprise of faith: ***think*** — *online giving or Offertory envelopes received in the mail, Lenten canisters, Ash Wednesday & Holy Thursday collections, support of the diocesan God’s Gift Appeal, special appeals, etc.*
- In summary this is the very way our parish life is structured: committees on **liturgy, education, social concerns, cemetery operations and finance and administration.**

A parish is not just a place where sacraments are celebrated and religion classes are taught. Hopefully **a parish is a community of people** who encounter one another as believers and disciples of Christ. The vibrancy of parish life is a concerted effort of all parishioners who honor their heritage, give of themselves, affirm others, seek the best, live in thanksgiving all the while firmly believing the best lies ahead when the Lords says to us, *“Well done good and faithful servant! Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world.”*
