

PASTOR'S NOTES

Trinity ((Love))

~ a most challenging article of faith

~ a most misunderstood word

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "*The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life.* ... It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith' [CCC 234]." That would mean the mystery of the Trinity trumps the great articles of faith about God becoming man (the Incarnation – the Christmas event) and Christ rising from the dead (the Paschal mystery – the Easter event). What is this belief about the Trinity, i.e., one God in three persons and how does this effect my life?

Scripture says "God is love [1 Jn. 4:8]." The Catechism states that love is the most fundamental passion [CCC 1765]. Therefore, God's deepest core is love. Personal love comprises a <u>lover</u>, <u>a beloved</u> and <u>the spirit of love</u>. Together and all in one instance this is the composition of Love. In God's name the Father is the lover, the Son is the beloved and the spirit of love is the Holy Spirit. Therefore, God is an eternal exchange of love – lover, beloved and spirit of love.

The Father dimension of love is the eternal going out of self to the other. The Son dimension of love is the total giving of self. The Holy Spirit dimension of love is the eternal facilitation of outgoing, sacrificial love.

On our part the story of creation states that we are made in the image and likeness of God. This suggests we are made in this very way — to go out of selves, giving sacrificially forever by always willing the good of the other. On the surface of things this seems impossible and incomprehensible. For us – human love is more going out of self to fill a vacuum or to meet a need, whereas God's love goes out of self to give of self. Human love is often conditioned and reciprocal, whereas God's love is sacrificial and merciful. Human love 'waxes and wanes', whereas God's love is forever loving. For most of us, true love falls far short of how we are created! The Fall (sin) of our first parents created a great chasm between God and man.

But in the Ascension of Christ to the Father, the Father sees love full and complete as it was meant to be. His Son, who shared our human nature, redeemed this 'broken love' and at the Last Supper graced the human family with the invitation to *"live on in my love* [Jn. 15:9]." For the Father this story of redeeming love must go on! Thus, on Pentecost he sends the risen and glorified spirit of His Son back to the human race.

Discipleship is accepting this invitation to 'love as He has loved us'. Such is the challenge of Trinity Sunday — to elevate love to its original stature as the name for God!
