PASTOR'S NOTES

Where are we at . . .?

A. National Eucharistic Revival

Over the course of the next 31 days the four (4) Eucharistic pilgrimages/processions from the north, south, east and west in the United States are wending their ways to Indianapolis, Indiana for the beginning of the National Eucharistic Congress on July 17th. That 5-day Congress will run until Sunday, July 21st and be a major celebration of the Eucharist and Christ's Real Presence among us in his greatest gift to the human race — **The Eucharist.**

These days will be filled with Eucharistic celebrations, talks, rallies, Eucharistic devotions, etc. – all aimed at reinvigorating our <u>faith in</u> and <u>love of</u> the Eucharist and Christ's Real Presence in the consecrated bread and wine of our many Eucharistic celebrations and the tabernacles of our churches.

Since we live in the northern part of the United States, **the northern route of the Eucharistic pilgrim-age/procession is known as the Marian route.** Like the other three pilgrimages/processions from the south, east and west – all began their journeys on Pentecost Sunday (May 19th) from their respective locations. This weekend the **Marian Route** of the Eucharistic pilgrimage/procession will leave the Diocese of Green Bay Wisconsin and be in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Wisconsin for next weekend (see the map in the church entry way for further details about the various routes and the National Eucharistic Congress in general).

Let us continue to pray for our National Eucharistic Revival and its prayer for a revival in our Eucharistic faith and the return of Catholic family and friends to regular Sunday Mass attendance and participation in the liturgy that makes heaven present on earth.

B. <u>Diocesan Capital Campaign</u>

In the midst of our National Eucharistic Revival the Diocese of Fargo launched a \$20 million capital campaign to enhance the life of our diocesan church. The campaign has a 4-fold focus — (1) upgrading the previous Maryvale Convent in Valley City (given as a pure gift to the Diocese of Fargo) into our diocesan retreat center; (2) bringing the Fargo Diocese's priests Pension Plan into line with surrounding diocesan priests pension plans; (3) establishing a priest's retirement center in Fargo; (4) returning 30% of all parish-raised money to that parish for necessary parish projects of their deliberations.

Within this campaign plan each parish/mission was given a goal in order to get to this \$20 million goal. St. Leo's goal is \$289,086; St. Thomas' goal is \$49,536. To date, thirty three (33) households from St. Leo's parish have pledged \$183,700, which is 64% of its goal. Six (6) households from St. Thomas parish have pledged \$17,520, which is 35% of its goal.

As noted by our two parish leadership team members [St. Leo's – Mark Weber, Mona Franck, David Glennon, Kelsey Lako and Luke Steckler; St. Thomas – Gary Milbrandt, Joe Killoran and Alecia Killoran] and myself – This is a worthwhile campaign and has our support! There are campaign envelopes at the back of the church for your convenience and support. All support is deeply appreciated!!

What is that up front??

For the next 22 Sundays in Ordinary Time there will a map in our meditation space. Each week there will be a stick pin and with the passing of each week small markers designating areas in the world where a Eucharistic miracle has occurred.

These post-Communion miracle meditations are not meant to focus on the 'spectacularness' of the physical miracle, but on God's intention for us to know, reverence and revere his Real Presence in that greatest of all his sacraments – **The Eucharist**. May these meditations help us grow in our love of the Eucharist and our regular attendance at Sunday Mass.
