PASTOR'S NOTES

The Ascension - what is the big deal??

<u>First and foremost</u> it celebrates the 're-opening' of access to God's life and happiness. Access to heaven had been closed since the sin of our first parents in the Garden of Eden. When God expelled them from the garden, God "stationed the cherubim and the fiery revolving sword, to guard the way to the tree of life." [Gen. 5:24]

This mystery of faith has a number of wonderful insights for our spiritual lives:

- (a) we are a pilgrim people, simply sojourners in this land. Our real home is heaven. Do not get too attached to the things of this world. They are passing realities. As St. Paul reminds us, "We do not fix our gaze on what is seen but on what is unseen. What is seen is transitory; what is unseen lasts forever" [2 Cor. 4:18], and "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" [Philippians 3:20].
- (b) at the end of time, if we find ourselves counted among the saved, like Christ we, too, will receive glorified bodies and find ourselves at the throne of the Father. What we do now in our earthly flesh is of great consequence. If our flesh is to be glorified, we must now live in the flesh in ways that are in keeping with what our glorified existence will someday be.
- (c) as our patron saint, St. Leo the Great, so richly said when speaking about the Ascension, "And so our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments." Christ has not abandoned us in the Ascension, but lives more fully in the sacraments of his Church.
