PASTOR'S NOTES

LENTEN CANISTERS —

The final tally for our 2024 Lenten canisters shows that we raised \$7514.07 from a total of 128 canisters. 2024 was a very good year. This is the 14th year we have used Lenten canisters as a parish Lenten corporal work of mercy. This year ooks like our fourth best year in terms of total money raised, and that is \$3317 more than our lowest year. In the last few years we have received some very generous gifts. This year we received a very generous gift of \$2000. Needless to say we are very grateful to our very generous givers. Those kind of gifts certainly raise our numbers.
