PASTOR'S NOTES

Coming into Focus -

- The National Eucharistic Revival

On the solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (*aka Corpus Christi Sunday*) on June 19, 2022, the Catholic Church in the United States launched a 3-year initiative known The National Eucharistic Revival. Its purpose was to inspire, educate and unite people around the gift and mystery of the Eucharist, which is the 'source and summit' of Christian life and living.

The first year of the Eucharistic Revival was focused on the diocesan church. In September of that year the Diocese of Fargo hosted a two day Redeemed Eucharistic Congress in Fargo. A number of speakers gave talks on the Eucharist. Bishop Andrew Cozzens who is Bishop of the Crookston Diocese and the bishop leader of this 3-year initiative, gave an overview of the hopes and purpose of having this 3-year initiative on the Eucharist. Real Presence radio hosted a number of programs exploring the gift and mystery of the Eucharist.

This second year of the Eucharistic Revival focused on the Eucharist in parish life. Our parishes of St. Leo's and St. Thomas spent post Communion reflections during the summer and Fall Sunday Masses on reviewing what the Catechism of the Catholic Church had to say about the multi-layered dimensions of Eucharistic life.

This second year will end with a **National Eucharistic Congress** in Indianapolis, Indiana on this coming July 17-21. Last Sunday (**Pentecost - May 19th**) four Eucharistic processions from the 4 directions in the United States began pilgrimages so as to converge in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress. The procession from the <u>East</u> began in New Haven, Connecticut; the procession from the <u>South</u> began in Brownsville, Texas; the procession from the <u>West</u> began in San Francisco; the procession from the <u>North</u> {which is nearest to us} began at the headwaters of the Mississippi river in Minnesota.

You are invited to review the poster board in St. Leo's Church entry for ongoing information on the upcoming National Eucharistic Congress as well as up-to-date information on the progress of the northern Eucharistic procession to Indianapolis that began at the headwaters of the Mississippi river.

The third year of the Eucharistic Revival will focus on the Church being missionaries of the Eucharist and taking its Truth 'to the world'. To kick-start this endeavor the Diocese of Fargo will be hosting a Redeemed Eucharistic Congress in Jamestown this coming September 6th and 7th. Again a number of speakers and events will fill this time of prayerful praise and formation in our love of the Eucharist. Further details about registering for this event as well as scheduling will be forthcoming shortly. It is hoped that as many as possible will be able to attend. **Please mark your calendars.**
