

Congratulations —

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that "the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace" [1285]. Therefore, Baptism raises us to the dignity of Christ's royal priesthood, Confirmation configures us more deeply to Christ and the Eucharist perpetually feeds us with the sacrament that redeemed the human race. The Papal conclave

On Wednesday, May 7th the papal conclave to elect the next Pope in the life of the Catholic Church will convene.

The governing document on papal conclaves – *Universi Dominici gregis* – declares that only Cardinals under the age of 80 at the death date of the Pope can be admitted as voting members. As of late April there would be 135 voting Cardinals out of a total 252 Cardinals in the Church. Ten (10) of these voting Cardinals would be from the United States. There are seven (7) retired American Cardinals. Here is the list of the American Cardinal electors followed by their [present age], their {date of being elected Cardinal}, by which Pope, and present status –
