

PASTOR'S NOTES

Understanding Christ's Kingship

This Sunday's solemnity of *Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe* is a recent addition to the liturgical calendar of the Church. It was declared a solemnity on December 11, 1925 by Pope Pius XI. He prayed this solemnity would be an antidote to the rise of secularism and atheism of his day. Being placed as the last Sunday of the church year this feast more properly signifies Christ's rule over all things, his kingly rights over the hearts and minds of all human beings as well as establishing the goal of our earthly pilgrimage and of human history.

But, the Lord's kingship is very different from most understandings of kingship. The 3-year Sunday cycle of Gospel readings for Christ the King Sunday present powerful insights into the way Christ's kingship is recognized:

- in <u>Luke's Gospel</u> [Lk. 23:35-45] (this year's Sunday reading) Christ as King hangs on the Cross between two thieves, humiliated and mocked, but retains royal power to lead human beings to the glory of paradise (the Good Thief);
- in <u>Matthew's Gospel</u> [Mt. 25:31-46] (next year's Sunday reading) Christ as King stresses that active love of neighbor will be a decisive criterion at the final judgment because Christ identifies himself with the poor.
- in **John's Gospel** [Jn. 18:33b-37] (two years from now) Christ as King is a prisoner before Pilate and affirms his royal dignity to Pilate and defines his rule against secular misconceptions of it.

Such is Christ's Kingship!!

Every year on the fourth Thursday of November we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, and perhaps recall some history of Pilgrims and Native Americans coming together to share the fruit of the harvest. With the march of time this day and time of the year has become highly commercialized, but Thanksgiving does afford us an opportunity to review the many blessings that have come our way. **As I see it there is thanks to be given:**

- > for the bounty of this land and its opportunities to pursue life, liberty and happiness
- > for the <u>gift of family/friends and neighbors</u> as we live in care and concern of others and together seek the common good;
- > for the gift of faith and its call to 'do what is right, love what is good and walk humbly with our God';
- > for the gift of hope that reminds us 'our citizenship is in heaven';
- > for the <u>gift of love</u> by which God reconciles the human family into a people who 'bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things';
- > for the <u>gift of Church</u> as the sacrament of salvation and the 7 sacraments through which Christ lives with us "until the end of the world";
- > for the gift of eternal life and all who have heard said to them "well done good and faithful servant ... come inherit the Kingdom prepared for you ..."

For all of this we surely give thanks!
