## **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### What is World Mission Sunday?

In your packet of Sunday Offertory envelopes the month of October has one marked as **World Mission Sunday**. Exactly what is World Mission Sunday?

There are 1124 mission territories throughout the world that, at best, can only sporadically have the Gospel preached, celebrate the sacraments, or do basic charitable works. World Mission Sunday is contrasted with <a href="Home Mission Sunday">Home Mission Sunday</a> [done in April], which offers assistance to mission dioceses within the United States who struggle to offer the services of the Church in an continuing manner. In contrast the World Mission territories are found in Asia, Africa, Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Eastern Europe.

Although World Mission Sunday was established in 1926 by Pope Pius XI, the call to do missionary work began when Christ ascended to heaven and commanded his apostles to "make disciples of all nations" [Mt. 28:19]. **Missionary works stands at the heart of the Church.** 

Prior to 1926 the missionary work of the Church was carried out through the organization called – **The** 

Society for the Propagation of the Faith. In the early 1800s monies raised in Europe through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith was given to the vast diocese of Louisiana in the United States. At that time this diocese of Louisiana along with its mission of Kentucky extended from the Florida Keys to Canada and west to our present-day West Coast. Of course that area covered this part of the country in which we now live.

As we in the United States were helped in our early days as the Church in the new world, **now it is our turn to sustain the mission work of the Church to the far reaches of our world today.** Our gifts support the training of priests and religious on their journey to priesthood and the religious life; support the work of religious in the running of orphanages, schools and medical clinics; enable catechists to share the Gospel and pass on the teachings of the Faith where the Church is too young, too poor and often faces persecution.

In keeping with this Jubilee Year of Hope, the title for this year's World Mission Sunday is – *Missionaries of Hope among all Peoples*. This theme also coordinates well with the call of our recent Eucharistic Revival to be missionaries of hope to the world.
