This week's Stewardship moment:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only son." ~ John 3:16

PASTOR'S NOTES

The Jubilee Year Pilgrimage – 'a great experience' – Go for it!!

All Jubilee years encompass the concept of a pilgrimage because we are on a journey (pilgrimage) to that final and grand jubilee of heaven. Earthly pilgrimages are meant to prepare us for that heavenly goal.

In calling for this Jubilee Year of Hope, Pope Francis recognized that most people could not make a pilgrimage to the four (4) major basilicas in Rome [St. Peter's; St. John Lateran; St. Mary Major and St. Paul outside the Wall]. Therefore, each bishop was encouraged to select pilgrimage sites within their diocese to which their people could make a pilgrimage and attain a Jubilee indulgence. In the diocese of Fargo Bishop Folda has designated six (6) pilgrimage sites.

To my knowledge a couple of parishioners have already visited all six diocesan sites and said 'it was a great experience'. People can visit these sites until the end of this Jubilee Year [Sunday, December 28, 2025].

By its very nature a pilgrimage is always marked by prayer and meditation. This year's Jubilee centers on the virtue of hope and we being pilgrims of hope. As we travel to these designated sites we bring the hope of Christ within us and in turn are renewed by the many graces of hope that have blessed this place of pilgrimage. In your prayer and meditation ponder the many blessings of hope celebrated at this site -- the hundreds of baptisms and confirmations, the thousands of Communions, the multitude of reconciled sinners, the glorious number of marriages, the many laid to rest in the Lord, the countless number of votive prayers offered for the many needs of broken humanity, etc. - all graces celebrated by our brothers and sisters of hope. Hopefully such prayer and meditation renews, strengthens and enlivens our hope in the Lord.

Each diocesan pilgrimage site is offering a special 'collectable coin' to memorialize your visit. All pilgrims who visit all six diocesan sites can receive a diocesan 'collectable coin' memorializing this Jubilee Year of Hope.
